In a few days our Lenten journey with the Good Shepherd will bring us back to the holy city of Jerusalem. As we would expect the Palm Sunday celebration, where we shout "Hosanna" and celebrate the presence of Christ in our midst, will soon lead into the valley of the shadow of death. We will sit with Jesus at the last supper table and be offered the bread of life which sustains us in our most desperate hour. We will remember Christ's prayers in the garden; how he pleaded with God for the unity of his

church. We will go deeper in that valley, growing appalled and grieved by the ugliness of human sin which could cry out for an innocent man's blood.

#### Where will the valley lead us? To the cross!

You might expect that noon on Friday, when the savior hangs crucified, is the lowest valley of human history. We invite you to journey with us through Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday. We believe the story holds a surprise long before the empty tomb. The valley, it seems, leads to the cross which "towers over the wrecks of time." Could the rugged cross be more of "a hill far away" where God's victory, forgiveness and resolve to change us is most powerful? Could the cross be the only thing high enough and strong enough to lift us out of every valley?

Our Holy Week journey will only be overcome by the triumphant proclamation of Easter morning, "Christ the Lord is Risen!!" Easter Sunday is the pinnacle celebration of our Christian year and we look forward to celebrating with each of you. Easter Sunday is only the beginning of the season of new life. We look forward to beginning a new journey with you on Easter titled, "Resurrections for a Maturing Faith." Each week we will explore a breakthrough of trust and understanding which can lead to a deeper more mature relationship with Jesus Christ and the church. We believe this Easter experience will give us confidence and clarity as we seek to "live in the house of the Lord forever!"


#### Join us after the supper at 7 p.m.

# Trustee's Ministry

#### **Relocation of Tombstones**

The Trustees are developing a master plan for the existing parking lot and the addition of new parking spaces in the main parking area, the office parking area, and the schoolhouse. The project will be completed in phases as the Trustees have many regulations, restrictions, and legalities to navigate with the Town of New Market and Frederick County.

The first phase of the project was to determine how many actual graves are located in the Education Building backyard. History has it that the stones belonged to the old Methodist Church that was located on main street. The head stones were scattered throughout town for many years until some loving servants gathered and placed them after the church purchased the Education Building from C&P in 1980. It was noted that two actual graves were placed in this area, but it was never certain which headstones marked them. The Trustees contacted a ground surveying company to scan the Education Building grounds and locate any graves that might there. Two graves were located near the sidewalk and are currently marked with red and white flags. The Trustees have asked and received permission to relocate the remaining 16 headstones that do not mark any graves. These headstones will be used to fill out the remaining two rows next to the sidewalk behind the Education Building. This will enable expansion of the parking lot upon jurisdiction approval. Mt. Carmel UMC and New Market UMC recently became involved in Stephen Ministry. This one-to-one lay caregiving ministry is named for Stephen, one of the first seven laypeople called by the early church to assist the apostles in caring for others. Stephen Ministry is truly ministry—caring for others in Jesus' name, doing the work that God has both called and gifted his children to do.

Do you feel a calling to care for others who are hurting? Do you desire the personal joy that comes from sharing Christ's love with people? Stephen Ministers are extensively trained and equipped before being matched to walk beside someone who is experiencing a tough time. The Stephen Minister meets with the hurting person weekly -- for as long as there is a need -- to listen, pray, support, and encourage. The Stephen Minister provides the care that helps prepare the way for Christ to provide healing.

Shortly after Easter, our Stephen Leader Team will begin training some of the members of our congregation to serve as Stephen Ministers. 

# FINANCIAL NEWS

The original 5-year Balloon mortgage for the schoolhouse and parsonage expired in October 2015. The finance committee has secured a new 5-year balloon mortgage with the original holder of the note BB&T. The new loan amount is \$177,871.00 with an interest rate of 4.4% and a monthly payment of \$1,325.00. The old loan payment amount was \$1,519.00. The Finance Team and the Trustees recommended to Church Council that the full rental amount of \$2,100.00 be applied to the monthly payment with the extra applied to the principal. This would reduce the principal over 5 years to \$83,791.00 compared to \$131,103 the principal that would be remaining if only minimum monthly payments were made for the 5 years. Council unanimously approved the motion with the caveat if general budget goals were not being met the Council could make the decision to apply the extra from the rental to the general budget.

#### Expectations for the Church Treasurer

- 1) An effective church treasurer disburses all funds received into the church treasury in a responsible and organized manner, with funds identified and bills paid when due so that the mission and ministry of the congregation is effective.
- 2) Qualifications for the Church Treasurer This leader benefits from one or more of these spiritual gifts: administration, discernment, giving, faith, helping.
- 3) Useful skills and experience for this position are skills and interest in financial matters; ability to keep detailed, accurate records and maintain appropriate confidentiality; passion for financially supporting the mission of making Christian disciples for the transformation of the world; ability to work with individuals and ministry teams.
- 4) Responsibilities of the Church Treasurer The treasurer will disburse all money contributed to the local church budget, keeping accurate records of how money is spent. The treasurer works with finances according to the guidelines established by the finance committee for total fiduciary responsibility, including compliance with all applicable governmental tax guidelines.
- 5) The treasurer works with the financial secretary to maintain records of all funds received and performs a quarterly fund records check. Designated gifts and bequests are managed by the trustees in accordance with paragraph 2533.5 of The Book of Discipline.
- 6) The treasurer works with the financial secretary and chair of the finance committee to make regular financial reports to the committee on finance, church council, the charge conference, and in some cases, the trustees.
- 7) The treasurer is accountable to the charge conference through the church council.
- 8) Time Requirement and meeting attendance expectations: The time commitment is ten hours per month plus attendance at the monthly Church Council meeting to produce budget vs. actual and Profit and Loss detail reports. Church Council is the third Tuesday of every month at 7 p.m. Attendance is also required at the Finance meetings which are held bi-monthly starting in January on the second Tuesday of the month at 7 p.m. both meetings are held in the Schoolhouse. Additional time each quarter is required to complete the tax filings. In January there is an additional five or six hours to do the yearend tax and conference filings.
