2016 Lent Mission Focus

For the six weeks of Lent we invite our congregations to join together in a season of living simply in order to save resources for missions. The missions we will support together are:

Imagine No Malaria - This mission of the United Methodist Church is steadily eradicating the deadly disease from the continent of Africa. Every \$10 donation purchase a bed net which will protect a family from disease carrying mosquitos. In addition our gifts provide education for disease prevention, research and medication. As a side benefit INM helped play a huge role in the defeat of Ebola and in on going health related efforts.

Our First Parish Young Adult Mission Trip - In a nation where young adults are leaving the church, we are seeking to engage and support our young adults as they seek to keep the faith and serve on Christ's behalf. Our offerings will help our team of 17-30 year olds travel to Puerto Rico this summer to serve among our brothers and sisters there.

Opportunities to give:

The collections on Ash Wednesday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Sunrise Service (at Fairview) will benefit these missions.

"Milk Money"- Each church will distribute Lent calendars and plastic "Milk Money Jars" at the services early in Lent. The calendar gives you ideas for how your family can sacrifice during Lent to allow space in your budget for giving to mission. Each time you choose to live simply you can place the money saved in the milk jug and return it on Easter Sunday.

Clothes for Campers is returning this April & May - Save your old clothes, towels, and linens! You can donate them, receive tax credit, and support a week of summer camp!

Hope 4 Kids Update:

75 children at 5 schools in the East Frederick and New Market communities are receiving packs each weekend. 1,094 packs containing 4,416 pounds of food have been sent home so far this school year!

Our churches have given GENEROUSLY! Through December, total Parish and Lion's Club giving is \$14, 478.42. This far exceeds our adjusted budget of \$10,989.84 after adding more children, more protein, and more long weekends. Abundance will be put towards next year. THANK YOU!

Our churches are serving GENEROUSLY! 79 volunteers of all ages have served in a multitude of roles so far this school year! THANK YOU!

Stephen Ministry

New Market UMC and Mt. Carmel UMC recently became involved in Stephen Ministry. This one-to-one lay caregiving ministry is named for Stephen, one of the first seven laypeople called by the early church to assist the apostles in caring for others. Stephen Ministry is truly ministry— service to others, caring for others in Jesus' name, doing the work that God has both called and gifted his children to do. In the next few months, our Stephen Leader Team will begin training some of the members of our congregation to serve as Stephen Ministers.
