Have you ever noticed that spring seems to come all at once and very slowly? Last Saturday the sun triumphantly rose claiming victory over the



winter freeze. Within hours the snow had melted and the park was filled with kites and kickball. We celebrated in an instant the arrival of a new season. The next morning however, when we went out with our toes exposed, we were bitterly reminded that the coming of spring is more a hard fight than an overnight transformation.

The same is true of Easter. We wake up on Resurrection morning and hear the good news, "*Christ is Risen! Death has been defeated!*" At once we are reminded that our Lord is not dead but living in our midst. Still, if we are honest, we must admit that we are like the early followers of Jesus. We can hear of an empty tomb and celebrate the possibility of life after death but, it's going to take a while for that reality and hope to really take hold.

For 40 days Jesus appeared to the disciples; he walked with them, met them at work, shared supper, appeared in their homes, and met them at the shore. Through *"many convincing proofs"* they were persuaded that Jesus has resurrected from the grave and that they could resurrect to new life with Him.

This Spring, we invite you to join us for Resurrection morning (Easter Sunday) and then for the season that follows. All at once we can hear the victory cry, *"Christ is Risen!"* In time we can claim the power of resurrection in our lives. Like a new spring overcoming the cold of winter we can be remade. Our fear of death overcome with hope for life eternal and our fear of insignificance overcome with a new since of purpose for this season of life.

We look forward to sharing a powerful resurrection season with each of you!

"On a Mission"

The goal of the joint mission teams of Fairview, Mt. Carmel, and New Market United Methodist churches is to maximize our time, talents and resources to serve and impact lives with Christ-like compassion in our local, national and global communities.

During the last several months, we have been "on a mission" to provide organization and structure to the missions process that will allow our congregations secure and fulfill our vision statement. We are excited to be moving forward and are currently seeking Project Proposals from all congregants who would like to initiate a mission project. Proposals are available through the church secretaries. Please use the information below to help guide you in the process.

What is considered a "mission"? As defined by the United Methodist Church, a mission is sending or taking resources, aid or services to people in the community (local to global).

What is the purpose of the Mission Team? Our primary responsibilities are to schedule, coordinate, evaluate and communicate missions within the churches in order to ensure that we are maximizing our time, talents and resources as we serve our communities.

How will the new collaboration between Mt. Carmel, New Market and Fairview churches benefit our projects, both old and new? It will foster greater participation and impact, ensure accurate and timely communication to all congregants, provide structure to the process, and allow for equity and balance among all mission projects.

What are the significant changes moving forward?

Any project that requests <u>financial</u>, <u>material</u>, <u>or acts of service and/or time from church congregants</u> must first be vetted by the joint Mission Team.

All missions will require a lead and a secondary/co-leader for the duration of the project. (Team members can assist with finding the right candidate if assistance is requested).

Mission lead(s) will be expected to provide a status report on their mission at the quarterly Mission Team meetings.

All written and verbal communications about projects will be coordinated and/or implemented by the Mission Team members.

How do I get started with implementing my mission project?

Once you determine that your project is in fact a mission as defined by UMC, determine what support you will request from *church congregants*: financial, material, or acts of service and/or time.

Complete a Mission Project Proposal and either submit it to a team member for review at next Mission Team meeting or attend the next scheduled meeting and present your project to the team in person. (If you need help with the form, feel free to ask a Team member for support.)

The committee will review your proposal and contact you with the status of your project.


