For thine is the kingdom and the power and glory forever!

A few years ago I visited a women in her last days who struggled with dementia to the point she could not remember her family. I shared scriptures with her hoping to convey a bit of peace but she responded with confusion. As I prepared to leave I knelt at her side and began to pray the Lord's Prayer. A few words in she became focused and then began to mouth the words. By "forgive us our trespasses" she was praying out loud. When I stumbled in surprise she continued without hesitation. We had assumed that all of her memories and expression were gone but the prayer unearthed a faith so deep that even when all else was lost the words remained.

As the season of Lent begins we seek to ground ourselves in this deep, forever faith. By learning and focusing on the words Jesus taught us to pray we will connect with our Savior in powerful ways. Each week we will explore one phrase, committing it to memory, and learning the depth of possibility within. By the end of lent we believe we will understand how to ground all of life in the guidance and love of Jesus.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesdays and continues for 40 days. This season has been set aside by the church for centuries as an opportunity to for us to turn from our sin and selfishness and grow in the grace of God's saving work. During Lent we often give up something significant to remind us of Christ's sacrifice on the cross and to calm our desires for earthy things. We also consider what spiritual discipline (habit) we can develop which will deepen our faith. This year we invite you to join us in the following disciplines as we observe a holy lent together:

- Dedicate 20 minutes or more each day to praying the Lord's Prayer and reading the daily devotional. A guide for your devotion and lessons on how to pray will be provided.
- Fast on Wednesdays and give your "lunch money" to the poor.
 - Fasting is an ancient and powerful spiritual discipline which reminds us that we do not live on bread alone. Jesus fasted for 40 days in the wilderness to strengthen his spirit and prove, perhaps to himself, his total dependence on God.
 - Fasting one day a week with your church family will mark this holy season with devotion. Use your lunch time on Wednesdays for prayer.
 - We challenge you to put your Lunch Money in a brown bag each week and bring it to church on Easter Sunday. Our lunch money will be given to the mission team to support missions in our local and global community.

WEDNESDAY LENTEN FAST & BROWN BAG MISSION:

Fasting on Wednesday has been a part of the Methodist Lent observance for hundreds of years. Going without food this one meal a week is a way to focus on our spiritual hunger rather than our physical needs. We encourage you to pray at lunch on Wednesdays, rather than eat, and put the money you would have spent on lunch in the brown bag. Bring this bag back on Easter Sunday. The funds will be used by our mission team to meet the needs of the poor. If you are unable to fast consider another sacrifice you could make (going without coffee, desserts, eating out) and see how much cash you can devote to serving the needs of others.

Worship In the Taize Style

The service being held on Sunday, February 15th at 7:00 p.m. at Fairview Chapel will be a unique worship experience in the Taize style. The Taize style of worship was started in a non-denominational religious community in the tiny town of Taize, France. The community's founder, Roger Schütz-Marsauche, the son of a Protestant minister, wanted to live with others who lived according to the scriptures. Brother Roger, as he was known, said he wanted the community to provide a loving presence in a world filled with suffering and turmoil. He founded the community in 1940 and during the Second World War they hid many Jewish refugees who were fleeing from the Nazis. Today the Taize Community is made up of more than 120 Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox brothers from 25 countries. Brother Roger never advertised his community, but people of all ages began to seek it out and now each year it is visited by more than 100,000 people from all over the world who are searching for communion with God.

The style of worship used by the Taize Community is now used in churches of many denominations around the world. Its purpose is to help us become aware of our Lord's presence as we sit quietly in a darkened space, listen in the silence, sing, pray and light candles which are used to focus us on God. All songs are simple, repetitive and prayerful and people are free to harmonize or sing the songs in different languages.

Rev. Sally Joyner-Giffin, who will be leading the service, developed a love of the Taize style of worship while she was in seminary at the School of Theology in Sewanee, Tenn. Services there were held in a beautiful old chapel and people who loved to worship through music and prayer would fill the church. Now, her current parish, Harriet Chapel, Catoctin Episcopal Parish holds a Taize service as part of the Thurmont Ministerium's Lenten Service series. The service is so peaceful and contemplative that many people look forward to it as part of their Lenten practices. God's Spirit can be felt in the quiet, candle lit space and people leave knowing "the peace of God that passes all understanding."

Special music will be provided by the choir from Harriet Chapel and guitarist Steve Hess.
