

- March 26: What is the truth about suffering and healing?
- April 2: What is the truth about life after death?

We are humbled to share this journey! With you we come to worship each week seeking the truth. With you we commit to the daily devotions & service opportunities on the LENT calendar in hopes that together we will discover how to belong to the truth!




