Whether financially, through volunteering or prayer, all the support we received helped make a huge impact on the lives of many in our community.

Just for the 2015-16 school year, at New Market we packed, 1,480 packs (6750 lbs.) and at Mt. Carmel we packed 1,332 packs (6200 lbs.). H4K was served by 42 volunteers from our churches and community who logged in over 80 hours each month.

We've already planned for next year and will begin working over the summer to prepare for our first packs early in the fall. At our June LIFT meeting Lauren shared a great devotion from Julia Battencourt on travel since a lot of us travel more during the summer months. Below is just a sample.

Most of us plan ahead when we go on vacation or before we set out on the road for a long trip. There are things we do to prepare.

• Pack.

Before we are ready to hit the road, one of the first things we have to do is make sure we are all packed. We'll need clothes, toothbrushes, and all the necessities. I have a tendency to over pack so I have to keep a watch on myself too.

As we are on our life journey we have to think about all the things we are taking along with us as Christians. Do we have unnecessary speech, bad habits, or sin that we shouldn't be putting in our suitcases? Are we remembering to take along those necessities like the fruit of the spirit and holy living?

• Tune Up

Before we take a trip my husband always makes sure to take our car into the shop and get a tune-up.

Spiritually we sometimes need a tune up too. Every once in a while our tires need kicked. We have to check over our lives and our hearts to see if there's anything keeping us from fellowship with the Lord. Is our Christian life running smoothly?

• Fill Up with Gas

Before we set out on a trip, I want our gas tank full. In our Christian lives, we need to fill up with prayer and the Holy Spirit or we won't get very far down the road. We need the Lord's help to keep on moving because we can't go on in our own strength.

• Necessary Papers & Maps or Directions

We can't get behind the wheel and start off down the road without some necessary information. We have to have our driver's license, legal license plate on our vehicle, and proof of insurance before we set off. Do you have the necessary papers to go to Heaven? Is your name written in the Book of Life? Are you a child of God? When we set out on a trip it is always nice to know the directions to where we are going. Remember opening those maps and they'd stretch clear across the car? Nowadays we have GPS systems in our cars or we Google maps on our phone or before we leave we Google it out on the computer and print out step by step directions. When we set out on our Christian journey, we need some directions too. Although we've accepted Christ and know we are going to reach our destination of Heaven, following directions for living down on this earth will make the trip so much nicer. Getting out our "Bible" map will give us all the details we need for the trip. It will tell us how to avoid roadblocks, how to handle emergencies, and all kinds of useful information.

Food and Water

If we start out on a road trip that's several miles we may end up on the road during meal time so we could end up having to stop for dinner or for a little shorter trip, we just may need some snacks or refreshment before we move on down the road.

On our Christian journey we need to make sure we don't miss any meals of the Word of God too. I think sometimes we get so busy driving down the road and doing busy things as Christians that we don't always stop and get refreshed with God's Word in worship like we should.

Conclusion:

Heaven is such a wonderful destination that the Lord has given for us to look forward to but He left us here on this earth to journey awhile first. What kind of streets are you traveling on before you end up there? What kind of landscapes are you passing? Are you journeying through areas that you should avoid as a Christian? Relying on the Lord's leading and keeping our feet on the right path daily will help us to navigate away from the areas that we should avoid and it will help us be right where the Lord wants us in our lives. Finance Update

Thank you for your continued giving during the first half of 2016. Together we have given \$77,319 for ministry. This amount falls shy of our budget goal for ministry of \$91,400 for the first half of the year. We are confident and hopeful that over the 2nd half of the year we can make up the difference.

Your generous and consistent giving is especially important over the summer. The next three months are our most active, and expensive! Vacation Bible School, A Young Adult Mission Trip, Teacher's Breakfasts, and preparing to launch fall ministries will provide countless opportunities for lives to be transformed. Together we will financially support the Lord's summer work!

Together we have:

- Funded Sunday school and special events.
- Supported the work of our pastors.
- Supported three scout troops.
- Open our building for parents of addicted children.
- Supported the work of Hope 4 Kids feeding over 70 children.
- Offered 6 small group/Bible studies.
- Began a Stephen Ministry to empower members to give excellent care.
- Housed 14 preschool children.
- And once again kept the lights on for ministry day and night!

Thank you for changing the world one dollar and one life at a time!!

As we move into the summer months, family vacations and other commitments will occasionally result in a missed Sunday. Please remember that our giving is not an "entrance fee" at worship but rather an on-going commitment to fund the work of the Lord 7 days a week 12 months of the year. When you miss a Sunday please double up your offering the week you return, or schedule a bank transfer (EFT) for your monthly giving or consider mailing a monthly check for your committed amount to insure consistent, generous giving.

- (EFT) The transaction set up by the donor with his/her bank is called an EFT transaction. The donor uses the bank's 'Bill Pay' feature to designate the church as the payee and schedules a one time or recurring transfer of funds to the church for a certain amount. What most people do not realize is that the bank actually sends the church a check by mail and the church then has to process it just like any other check it receives during the weekly Service. If you choose this process, please contact the church office of your intent and we will supply you with yellow EFT cards that you can place in the collection plate when you are present in worship. The card reminds you of your contribution during the month and reminds others of your faithfulness and commitment to regular giving.
