Did you ever wonder why we worship on Sundays? Do we worship on Sundays because that is the only day the pastor works or that it is the best day that brunch is available?

The answer seems simpler than that. We worship on Sunday because it is the Sabbath and we are commanded throughout scripture to honor this day and keep it holy. Right? Well our Jewish friends and neighbors might have something to say about that. The traditional Sabbath is celebrated by observant Jews from sundown on Friday to sunset on Saturday. The tune sunrise sunset from Fiddler on the Roof is now ringing in my head.

After the first Easter the early Christian church determined that the resurrection was so transformative for Jesus followers that they would reserve every single Sunday as a day to celebrate the resurrection. **They chose to begin every week with a "little Easter" and an opportunity to worship the resurrected Lord.** The commandment to keep a Sabbath day holy was shifted to Sunday and the first day of the week became reserved for connecting as believers, praying for and encouraging one another, studying scripture, and most importantly honoring God with their praise.

Throughout this Easter season we have been blessed to experience the ways the Lord lifts us and moves us during worship. We have celebrated baptisms and the reception of new members, many have picked up their bible again to study the daily lectionary devotional scriptures found in each bulletin. We have been blessed by full churches of knowers and seekers of the Lord. Several in our midst have experienced the power of Jesus' forgiveness; others experienced healing or a profound sense of God's presence. One described worship as "a warming hug". Some even considered what it means to choose Jesus as Lord and Savior for the first time. All of these holy encounters reminds us what a gift worship is to us.

Still we must remember that worship is really NOT ABOUT US!! Worship is our gift to God! Singing hymns lifts us and reaffirms our beliefs but God is our audience! God is the one we come to say is "worthy" of our time, our songs, and our praise! We worship to honor God with our presence and our words and to announce to the world that God is our Lord and we live to honor HIM! Worship is a pivotal part of our witness. Worship is also one primary opportunity to live out the call Jesus gave us as he ascended into heaven,

"Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation.

Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." Mark 16:15-16a

Worship accomplishes a lot of powerful things but we must **remember that one** of the goals of preaching is to share the GOOD NEWS with those who have not heard yet!!

Thus our spring challenge is that each family invite at least one friend or neighbor to worship with you!!! As preachers we care about every person who can hear our voice but what causes our heart to beat faster is to preach for someone who is hearing about the love of Christ for the first time!! Every one of us is in relationship with someone whose life could be transformed by spending time in God's presence and hearing God's word. How can you make an effective invitation for them to worship with you? Inviting friends, neighbors, and family to join you in worship is a part of your offering to God and can be a huge boost to your faith.

Our worship teams continue to refine and enhance our worship service so that you have powerful opportunities to praise God and you can trust that any Sunday you risk yourself to bring a friend to church they will be blessed from the parking lot to the Benediction.

34th Anniversary Celebration on May 29th

The restoration of Fairview Chapel will be celebrated on May 29th during the 7 p.m. service in word, song, and the celebration of Holy Communion. This special evening of worship will be guided by Rev. Wayne Hall from the Dry Run Church of the Brethren. Rev. Hall has been a regular volunteer pastor at Fairview for many years. Since his official retirement from the Locust Grove Church of the Brethren, he has pastored Dry Run Church, a small Pennsylvania church. He also continues to minister on special occasions for Fairview. Rev. Hall is known for his vibrant and creative messages and as a faithful friend and servant to Fairview's ministry and mission outreach.

The evening will include special musical groups from the Locust Grove Church and remembrances of the chapel's restoration along with a unique message. Following the service refreshments will be served to all in attendance.

The chapel was restored in 1982 by a group of faithful Christians from the area near the crumbled walls where the 1847 Methodist Church had once flourished. The small group was guided by Rev. Peggy Johnson from Mt. Pleasant UMC. Roger Dronenberg who had attended the original church as a child ignited the group with his vision of a chapel restored with the style of the original church. A new mission of service to the local surrounding communities was begun. The restorers worked diligently using their hands, their skills, and their devout faith to replace the walls that had crumbled into a pile of rubble through the years of unuse.

Now the quaint restored chapel on the 'hill' holds regular services on Sunday evenings at 7 p.m. with visiting volunteer pastors and outstanding musicians representing a variety of denominations. The services are held by the light of candles, oil lamps and wall sconces with music from an antique pump organ and furnishings of an earlier time.

The vision was fulfilled by "the faithful restorers" and faithful Christians <u>still</u> volunteer their time and services to promote and continue "the mission of Fairview." Fairview "has risen" and lives on as an active community of Christians who welcome <u>all</u> to share in the creative worship experiences and ministry of this small house of God.
