Pastor's Page

**¹ Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked
² but whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night. ³ That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither— whatever they do prospers. Psalm 1**

The month of October has always been a favorite time of the year in my life. The onset of cooler weather reminds me of the days of my youth as I was tasked with cleaning up my grandfather's garden to get ready for winter. The garden was pretty well spent and there was much work to be done with the removal of dying tomato plants and weeds that were ignored during the summer. It was not always work though; the devilish side of me could always find joy in throwing rotten tomato's at my friends when they passed by on their bicycles, this always prompted a town wide food fight and normally ended up with more than a few irritated adults swearing that we would never be able to sit down again unless we cleaned this mess up. It was well worth it despite the chewing out we received. I fondly remember cutting down the wilted peonies bushes and as I hauled them to the edge of the yard near the woods (today they would say compost pile back then we were just trying to get rid of the stuff). I would sing the beloved hymn bringing in the sheaves. Autumn always reminded me of God's bounty and blessings. As I reflect on the past year I am so grateful for the promises of God. That if we write the words of God on our minds and hearts, if we do not follow in the ways of the wicked (tomato throwing does not count, I checked) we are promised to be like trees planted by deep streams of water bearing fruit at just the right time.

Psalm 1 invites us to liken our lives to that replanted tree. We are invited to consider the fruit which we are blessed to experience. We are promised that if we are REPLANTED in the right place then we will not wither up but rather bear fruit at just the right time! What does it mean to be REPLANTED? I imagine that means we uproot ourselves from the "ruts" we so often end up in. The ruts of a secular life can consume our time, stress us, and surround us with stuff but do not satisfy our souls, nor create harmony in our relationships, nor provide any real purpose to our living. Once uprooted we have the ability to be REPLANTED by streams of water. The Lord invites us to be planted in God's life giving presence through God's life giving Word. When we are drinking up the Lord's teaching and provision we experience blessing and can then live a life which is spiritually productive.

In our church family we are witnessing in this season how God provides a harvest of beautiful fruit when God's people put down deep roots in prayer, worship, discernment and service. We have some fruit to celebrate! If you were in worship at New Market this summer you saw full pews and children playing on a new playground. If you drove by Mt. Carmel last Sunday night you saw a full parking lot because the church was full at 6 p.m. of youth and evening worshipers. If you worshiped at Fairview this month you would have witnessed a steady stream of new visitors. If you came to a "Hope for kids" packing session you would have witnessed the fruit of great leadership as over 50 people helped (over two nights) to prepare packs of food for over 70 kids at 5 schools. Together we are getting to taste the sweetness of the harvest God provides as we seek together to be faithful servants and stewards.

This fall we invite you to be planted through prayer, worship, Bible study, fellowship, and service. Our prayer is that each person who our community can reach will hear and respond to the invitation to come and put down roots in a restored relationship with God and taste the goodness of what your life can accomplish!

Although membership is not required to be a part of our church community, by being a member, it indicates that you have made a commitment to not only upholding the ministry of NMUMC but to your own personal spiritual growth and development. When you choose to join NMUMC, we will ask you two questions. These questions are at the heart of our mission and ministry.

The first question relates to a very important understanding of our congregational life. We believe that life is a dynamic journey and our understanding of the faith, scripture and our church life should reflect that dynamic nature. Our approach to ministry, our reading of scripture, the integration of faith and life and our perspective on the world is never static. Our quest is to move forward in the spirit of love, embraced by God's love and opening our lives to embrace one another. To be part of this community is to understand that we are ever evolving and open to the nurturing, challenging and ever-present Spirit of God's love.

Secondly, our life of faith is not limited to our church life; rather, the church is called to help nurture our lives of discipleship in the world. Our lives of discipleship are encouraged and supported by our faith; at the same time, our faith is strengthened and shaped by our faithful witness in the world.

With this understanding, the first question of church membership is this:

As a Christian community, we hold that the life and teachings of Jesus are central in our conduct, discipleship and community life. We further believe that our walk with God is indeed a journey and there is great benefit in traveling that journey together. Will you share your journey of faith and your walk with God in the community called the New Market United Methodist Church?

The second question of church membership has been asked in one form or another for more than 200 years:

Will you support the ministries of New Market United Methodist Church by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service and your witness?

Although the intent is usually to join a local congregation, a United Methodist is, by identity and design, a part of the larger denomination. Our covenant is with Jesus the Christ and with the church (local and denomination) seeking to be Jesus' disciples in the world. Although each individual must decide how he or she will live out this covenant, we try to create an environment of invitation, nurture, challenge and mutual accountability, as we together grow in our discipleship.

What is Stephen's Ministry?

It is a one-to-one caring ministry that takes places in congregations that use the Stephen Series System. Lay caregivers are empowered - called Stephen Ministers - to provide high-quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are hurting. In the book of Acts, chapter 6, Stephen was chosen to provide caring ministry to those in need.

Since the time of the Apostles, caring ministry has been considered a hallmark of the Christian faith community. More than 12,000 congregations, from more than 160 denominations in all 50 states, 10 Canadian provinces and 24 other countries, have had Stephen Ministry going strong for more than 30 years.

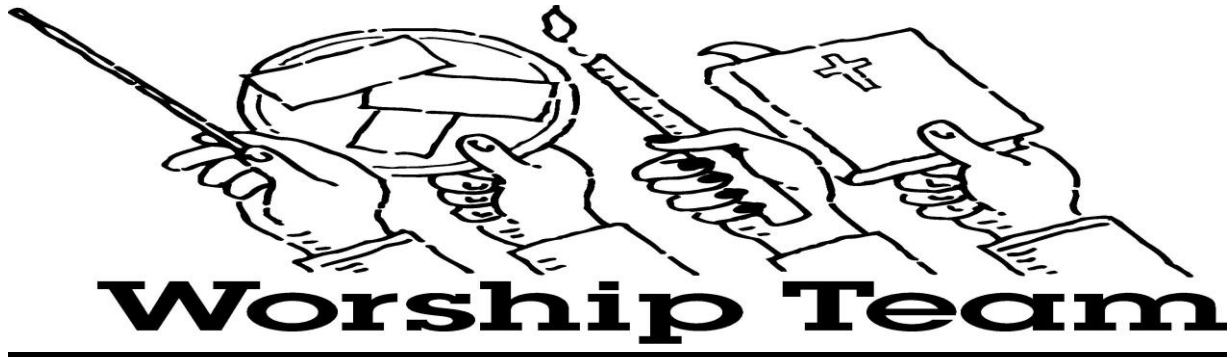

Two meetings, Call to Prayer & Self Denial in February and World Thank Offering in November, are special mission programs and circles meet together at the Schoolhouse for those programs.

We have many ongoing programs, including:

- Send monthly cards to our "Friends to Care For" and make visits as well
- Sponsor a community Game Day at the Schoolhouse on the third Wednesday of each month at 1:30 p.m.
- Organize most of the memorial luncheons
- Present a gift to every baby baptized
- Sponsor a Friendship Luncheon most years
- Sponsored several Talent Service Auctions to raise funds for special projects, such as redoing the Educational Building kitchen, the Schoolhouse bathroom, assisting with the ramp project and purchasing chairs for the Schoolhouse.
- We are members of the Board of Childcare and support the Falling Waters, WV center with cookies and items for their Thanksgiving baskets.
- Decorate the Schoolhouse seasonally
- Sponsor a congregational outing at Christmas and also in July and August when we don't have a regular meeting

This past year we supported six local agencies with \$50 each and paid our \$500 pledge to the District for mission projects.

We have 15 active members and five very supportive members. This is a very loving, caring and sharing group. We'd love to have you join us as we pray, study, and seek to do His will.
