

You have a nice size rock which represents that which is most important to you. If you put the rock in the jar first, you will have plenty of space to pour pebbles in all around. Almost all of your

pebbles (the good stuff you want to incorporate into your families' life) will fit. A few pebbles will fall to the side and you will be healthier without them. On the other hand, if you pour in the pebbles first, your life will fill up fast, and when you try to force the rock in, the pebbles will not give up space. You will be left busy, tired, and frustrated!

Do you like active games, sports, and lessons that relate? *Then active faith is for you!*


Do you enjoy being creative? How about painting on a canvas, listening to music, acting out a drama, clay? *If so give creative faith a try!*

First named usher will be the primary usher, it is this usher's responsibility to hand out bulletins and to complete a head count 15 minutes into the service, the head count should include everyone in the sanctuary and everyone in nursery including helpers, they head usher should also sit in the pews at the rear of the sanctuary in case there are any latecomers or to be able to view anyone who may need assistance during the service, the second named usher will help with the offering and communion when applicable.

Close out is the Trustee in charge to make sure the Education building and the schoolhouse are secure, the heat turned down to 60 degrees and lights are off.




