# The Wise and Foolish Builders

<sup>24</sup> "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is **like a wise man who built his house on the rock.** <sup>25</sup> The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; **yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock.** <sup>26</sup> But everyone who hears these words of mine and **does not put them into practice** is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. <sup>27</sup> The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, **and it fell with a great crash.**"



Is your foundation rock solid? Do our kids know how loved they are? Have we shared faith with them in ways that will uplift, guide and catch them during the adventures and storms? 
#### **Stephen Ministers to Be Commissioned on September 18**

The Mt. Carmel and New Market UMC congregations will be commissioning our first group of Stephen Ministers during the worship services on September 18 at both churches. After this commissioning, these nine men and women will be available to be matched with care receivers who can benefit from the type of care that Stephen Ministers uniquely provide.

The nine men and women who will be commissioned as Stephen Ministers on September 18 are: Bob Burdsall, Andrea Day, Mindy Hanlon, Lynn Harden, Jodi Phillips, Emma Reise, Patty Robinson, Karen Toombs, and Nick Wood. In the spring of 2016, these faithful servants felt a call to Stephen Ministry and applied to become Stephen Ministers for our congregations and community. Since that time, they have been receiving specialized training in Christian caregiving that will equip them to provide confidential, one-to-one Christian care to people experiencing a crisis or going through a difficult time. Each Stephen Minister meets weekly with his or her care receiver for around an hour to listen, care, encourage, pray, and provide emotional and spiritual support for the person. Caring relationships last for as long as the person's need persists.

We hope that you will be able to join us at one of the worship services on September 18 to celebrate, affirm, and bless our new Stephen Ministers. Please continue to pray for them and to ask God to bless their ministry and to work through them to bring hope and healing to those whom they serve.

Our Mt. Carmel/New Market parish is blessed to now be one of more than 11,000 congregations worldwide, representing 160 Christian denominations that use the Stephen Series system of lay caring ministry developed by Stephen Ministries in St. Louis.

## **Tour of Antietam**

A fourth guided tour of Antietam, Maryland's major Civil War battlefield, is planned for Saturday, September 24. Nick Wood, who for six years served as managing editor of *MHQ: The Quarterly Journal of Military History*, will be our tour guide. We will meet at 9 a.m. at the New Market Education Building for a brief orientation, then head to South Mountain, the first battle in the campaign, and then Sharpsburg, the bloodiest single day of fighting in the American Civil War.

We will probably take private cars, depending on interest. Midway through the day we will top at the visitor's center for a film and restrooms, and will stop at Burnside Bridge for a picnic lunch (bring your own). Time permitting, we will stop on the way home for ice cream, and probably get back to New Market around 4:30 p.m. There will be a sign-up sheet in the back of the sanctuary.

Almost everything at Antietam can be seen from a car, but we may (depending on athletic ability and interest) walk about some of the battlefield, on well-marked trails.

#### **Choir Year Begins**

In September, members of the adult choir will resume practicing Thursday evenings and Sunday mornings, to resume serving as the voice of the congregation. After a pleasant summer that gave the choir an opportunity to sit with their families and friends during worship, they will resume sitting together, to lead the congregation in hymns and regularly present anthems during the worship service.

As we start up this fall, it is the ideal time to join the choir. We're all just starting the music year, and new recruits will know as much as everyone those first few weeks (except for our most veteran singers, who have seen almost everything we sing).

We sing mostly contemporary music along with traditional anthems and even some classical pieces. The choir meets in the Education Building Library from 7 to 8:30 p.m. Thursdays and practices there at 10:30 Sunday mornings before every 11 a.m. service. To join the choir, we ask only that you commit to coming to practices regularly. We have no auditions. We don't require you to have a remarkable voice or the ability to read music, although we're ready to welcome those with exceptional talents, too. The choir is open to anyone who enjoys singing, enjoys being around other people singing worship and praise music, and wants to be inspired weekly with uplifting words and melodies and a supportive group of friends.

Attend our first practice at 7 p.m. September 1st and see if the adult choir meets your needs.

# Thank-you for funding our summer ministries!!

As New Market begins the transition from the heat and travel of summer to the cooler and back to school season of fall we, as your finance team, wanted to update you as our congregation on where we stand from a financial standpoint. As always, we want to thank you for your generous and continued giving that has built a growing church community and continues to help us reach out with new ministries, both locally in Frederick County and internationally with our recent mission trip to Puerto Rico. Our goal is to build and empower disciples for Jesus Christ and we continue to prove that our faith and our growth walk in tandem.

This year to date we have seen steady growth in church attendance and discipleship. We had 40 students attend our vacation bible school; 2 of our youth and 1 adult attend summer camp; 11 missionaries travel abroad to help repair 6 homes; and have prepared teacher breakfast for New Market Middle and Elementary schools. Our Hope4kids backpack ministry continues to involve a greater number of community groups and we are gearing up for a new preschool year in which we have doubled the attendance rate in the afternoon class and have maintained the same number of students in the morning Pre-K. All of this is a direct reflection of our 'presence in the greater community' and our commitment to continued funding of these programs.

During the church year we see our weekly offerings vary, particularly over the summer months where we are enjoying time away with families, attending summer sports or other obligations that cause attendance to wane. With our continued outreach and community involvement we ask that all of us reflect on our ability to contribute and aid in funding as we enter the fall and winter season. We as a church community have shown in the past that our generosity and commitment to our mission statement can overcome any obstacle through prayer and reflection.
