
Dinner and Fellowship for 6 or 8!

Roots – I was in line at a store and the lady in front of me was holding a plant. I asked her what it was and there began our conversation on gardening. She said she has a friend who is a horticulturist and she asked him for some tips on gardening. He said most people make the mistake of watering plants from the top and maybe the water doesn't get all the way down to the roots. He told her an inexpensive way to water is to take a soda bottle that has a screw on cap. Cut the bottom off the bottle and puncture holes in the cap. Push the bottle down into the soil and let the water go into that. This is also good for indoor plants. I have an African violet that I water from the bottom and it is beautiful.

In the parable about the farmer scattering seeds (Matthew 13: 3-8) it says in verses 5 & 6 that seeds fell on shallow soil and the roots had no nourishment. We have to nourish our roots by digging into God's word and let His Spirit flow into us like water on roots and fill us with His knowledge and cause us to blossom out with His love and will. It's amazing to me how I can read scripture many times over but one day it's like a light bulb goes off in my brain and I understand what the Lord means. Putting into practice what we learn God wants isn't always easy but we don't give up – I know for a fact that our Lord shows us the way. Who knows better how our lives should be but the Creator of us all!


