40-DAY PRAYER JOURNEY/ PRAYER & VISION CIRCLES

It is your pastor's hope and belief that the summer forty-day prayer challenge will have the potential to dramatically alter the rest of your life. We believe if you press into God's presence like never before, you will experience God like never before.

There is nothing magical about forty days, but there is something biblical about it. It is the number of days Jesus spent in the wilderness fasting and praying. It marked a critical chapter in His life---the transition from His earthly father's business to his heavenly father's business. Your pastors would like to challenge you and themselves to take our prayer lives into a different spiritual level. If we want God to do something new within us, we cannot keep doing the same old thing. We are looking forward to the revelations of new gifts and visions from the Spirit that comes from deep intentional prayer.

As a guide, we will be using the prayer devotional; Circle Maker. This is a book written by Mark Batterson that encourages us to circle everything in intentional and dedicated prayer. He uses the reference of the people of Israel circling the city of Jericho until the walls came tumbling down. What walls of oppression, fear, regret, addiction, healing, etc., do you want to come tumbling down this summer and beyond? The prayer devotional encourages us to draw a circle around ourselves in prayer first and to pray for a revival for the person within the circle. We then start drawing prayer circles around the areas that need *Holy Change* in our lives, the lives of our community, nation and world.

We are given encouragement to pray in the scriptures, 2 Chronicles 7:14, "If my people who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land.

We will not be coming to God in prayer with a prescribed planned agenda, our true purpose is to get into God's presence so God can outline God's agenda for us, we will pray about what to pray about. As people and situations come into our mind we will circle these things in prayer and trust that for as long as it takes, God will answer those prayers if we don't give up.

Your pastor's prayer is that each day your journey in prayer will bring new discoveries and that these discoveries will change the way you pray forever. When we change the way we pray with faithful obedience then everything changes to the glory of God. Directions on how we would like to accomplish this are described on the next page.

Prayer and Visions Circle Logistics



This Summer will be a season for focused prayer at New Market.

Together we will seek God's vision for our families and our church! We will be unified by a by a sermon series called "The Circle Maker." Our services will contain messages which motivate and guide us into a lifestyle where everything is circled in bold prayers which honor God.

We will look forward to short sermons and longer prayer segments in worship!

On Father's Day, June 18th, we will **give each worshiper a copy of "Draw the Circle" a 40 Day Prayer Devotional** that will invite us to pray together daily as we seek God's direction and provision. Our goal is for each participant to read, meditate, journal and circle in prayer the things and people that come into your mind. The goal is to read three devotions from the book per week. This will allow everyone to take their time and really meditate and journal on each devotion.

We will also be inviting every worshiper to circle up by participating in a "Prayer and Vision Circle." Each participant (YOU!) will receive a call from one of four prayer leaders. These leaders will inform you of the scheduled meeting date, time, and location of when the prayer circle is to be held. We encourage everyone to make every effort to attend these holy times of scripture and prayer circling. At the first meeting participants will be instructed on how to circle things in prayer. Each circle will meet once in June/July and August for a meal or fellowship time and prayerful conversations with God. Our prayer circles will be circling four areas of concentration: Community, Nation, World, and Personal Prayer Needs. When the group meets; their focus of prayer will be on one of the first three topics; they will discuss and write down prayers to be circled for the particular topic and any personal prayers of the group. These concerns will be passed on to the next group who will add their prayers on top of the ones already listed. There will I also be space in these gatherings to discuss visions and promptings from the Lord on how NMUMC will faithfully follow the Lord's call into the future. In the evening of September 8th all groups will meet for a tent revival and prayer meeting in the church graveyard.

During the summer the sanctuary will be open for participants to engage in private prayer and reflection on Wednesdays from 9am – 2pm. Pastor Scott will also be available during this time if you would like him to prayer with you. There will also be a weekly group prayer opportunity that will gather in the sanctuary every Thursday at 8:30pm immediately following the men's study group meeting. We encourage those who are joining the men's group for prayer on that day to consider fasting after breakfast until after the prayer time. Please plan on joining us in obedient and faithful prayers for all.

Prayer group leaders; Patty Robinson, Susan Stevens, Richard Stonebraker, and Pastor Scott You will be receiving a call from one of these leaders between June 12th through the 17th to inform you of dates, times, and location of the prayer circle gatherings. If you do not receive a call in that time period, please contact the church office. We look forward to a summer of intentional prayer and devotions and how those disciplines will begin to bear fruit.

Tour of Gettysburg with Nick Wood



July 8th @ 9am – Meet in the church parking lot

Some argue that Gettysburg was the battle that decided the Civil War. Three days of savage fighting just over the Pennsylvania line, an hour from our church, left the Confederacy unable to advance further, and while the war dragged on nearly two more years, the eventual Northern victory from that point was certain. On Saturday, July 8, only a few days and 154 years after the battle, the Outreach Committee has planned an opportunity to trace the fighting of those three days with Nick Wood, for five years he was the managing editor of Military History Quarterly. Learn of the event in Frederick that changed the course of the battle, and see a portion of the battlefield that doesn't show up on most tours, but which may explain why Pickett's Charge failed on that third, decisive day.

We'll be taking a 15-seat van, leaving the church parking lot around 9 a.m., and having a bring-your-own picnic lunch at Devil's Den. While never leaving the van will be possible, those able to walk a bit will have opportunities to appreciate where fighting occurred at Big Round Top, to enjoy the views from Little Round Top, to appreciate some of the memorials and begin to walk along the route of Pickett's Charge. Then we will stop to see the High-Water Mark of the Confederacy. We'll stop at the visitor's center (and bathrooms), and hope to return to New Market by 6 p.m.

There will be a charge of \$16 per person, to cover the cost of the van, or a bit more if we need to hire a driver with a Class B license. Ask Nick (301-865-5378) for more information.
