The week of July 7th-12th we will send a 15-person team of ten youth and five adults, led by Pastor Ed, to serve those impacted by Hurricane Matthew (2016) and Hurricane Florence (2018) on the coastal areas of North Carolina. Our team will help improve living conditions through projects like roofing, drywall repair, and other miscellaneous tasks.

During the month of February, the school held a non-perishable food drive and selected Hope 4 Kids as one of their food recipients. We received over 250 pounds of food items that will be distributed next month to hungry kids attending the six local schools we serve. The generosity of NMMS is a very timely blessing, as H4K recently began serving more than 100 students each week. Hope 4 Kids will pack at Mt. Carmel on 4/7 and 5/5 after the 11 a.m. service (in the basement) and at the New Market Schoolhouse from 6-7 p.m. on 4/16 and 5/21. Clean Closets for Campers (Clothes for Campers)

Clean Closets for Campers is a church and community partnership that can build up our campership fund. You can be a part of the faith foundation of a child by simply cleaning your closets! *Clean Closets for Campers* will work hand in hand with our church to collect gently-used clothing, shoes, purses, belts and hats, blankets, sheets, towels. Once collected, Mission Partners will pick up the donations, and give our campership fund 50% of the current market value of the goods.

What do I do with my donations? There will be a trailer parked at New Market UMC in the office parking lot starting April 1st and ending on the 10th of May. New Market UMC is located at 5 Prospect St., New Market. The trailer will be unlocked and there will be non-cash donation slips in a clear packet on the rear door. **Please bag clothes in sturdy plastic bags.**

There will also be a collection at Mt. Carmel on May 5th during the 9:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. services. Bring your donations that day and place them on the hood of your car; the youth will collect the bags during the services and take them to New Market.

Where does the donated clothing go? Most donated items stay inside the U.S. and are made into reusable rags, eco-friendly insulation for homes, or resold at thrift stores. A small percentage is sent abroad to companies that create local jobs in the resale of affordable clothing. Be sure to tell your friends and neighbors to join in on the donations.




