### "A Season for Changing Your Perspective"

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the LORD. 9 "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." Isaiah 55: 8-9

As I headed out of my driveway yesterday, I felt like I was in a winter funk. The weather has been gloomy, as March often is, and I had a longing for the chilling days of late winter to be over (although for my wife's sake I prayed for one ground covering snow), then winter could be over. As I came to the end of the lane I ran headlong into the universal promise of Spring and rebirth: Robins! The area around the AMVETS sign at the entrance to our driveway was literally covered with them and it gave me hope. The song *Hymn of Promise* came to my mind as I continued on my day. As Will Greer in "Jeremiah Johnson" once quoted: "winter is a long time coming".

As we head into this Easter Season we need to remind ourselves that yes, there is a sometimes dark and gloomy world we inhabit, but there are signs of promise if we learn how to look for them. Your pastors encourage you to join the church in the final days of our Lenten Journey as we head into Holy Week. It is a joy to celebrate the Palm parade together and lift our voices in praise on the morning of the resurrection, but if we only come for the victory celebrations we often miss what was defeated on our behalf. That takes place on the cross. We encourage everyone to set aside time during Holy Week to immerse yourself in the entire story. Come to the table with the body of Christ on Holy Thursday, see the story in a whole new way, partake in the sacraments and prepare your hearts and your minds, to have the courage to follow Christ to the cross on Good Friday.

The Good Friday messages challenge us to "See Yourself from the Cross" and "See Your Savior". Can we see ourselves as both the thieves on Jesus' right hand and left hand? Do we not cry "save us if you are the Son of God", while simultaneously asking "remember me when you come into your Kingdom"? Can we see ourselves through Jesus' eyes from the cross and "see" the savior on the cross? Can you see yourself as one for whom Jesus died?

We will leave silently from the darkened sanctuary into the dark night with great expectations for Easter morning, when the stone has been rolled away and the tomb is empty, except for a linen and sunshine. Pastor Jenny's Easter message "Living with Easter Lenses" and Pastor Scott's "Foolish for Christ" will pack hope and a challenge for a new "Easter" way of living.

Pastor Scott, Jenny, Helen and Ed invite you to take the whole journey and remember the words: "Today thou shalt be with me in paradise".

### **Date Change** - Tour of Gettysburg with Nick Wood




Saturday, March 24th @ 9 a.m. – Meet in the church parking lot

Some argue that Gettysburg was the battle that decided the Civil War. Three days of savage fighting just over the Pennsylvania line, an hour from our church, left the Confederacy unable to advance further, and while the war dragged on nearly two more years, the eventual Northern victory from that point was certain. On Saturday, March 24th you will have an opportunity to trace the fighting of those three days with Nick Wood, for five years he was the managing editor of *Military History Quarterly*. Learn of the event in Frederick that changed the course of the battle, and see a portion of the battlefield that doesn't show up on most tours, but which may explain why Pickett's Charge failed on that third, decisive day.

Jeff England will be driving a van, leaving the church parking lot around 9 a.m. While never leaving the van will be possible, those able to walk a bit will have opportunities to appreciate where fighting occurred at Big Round Top, to enjoy the views from Little Round Top, to appreciate some of the memorials and begin to walk along the route of Pickett's Charge. Then we will stop to see the High-Water Mark of the Confederacy. We'll stop at the visitor's center (and bathrooms), and hope to return to New Market by 6 p.m.
