

Our Mission for November

Mission of Mercy's Maryland/Pennsylvania Mobile Medical & Dental Clinic Program has been serving the sick and needy in the region since 1994. It has grown into a charitable organization that serves nearly 5,000 patients annually at seven clinic sites in Maryland and two in South Central Pennsylvania via a mobile medical van. At Mission of Mercy, no one is denied care. All services are provided free, regardless of race, color, creed, national origin or religion.

Headquartered in Frederick, Maryland, The Maryland/Pennsylvania mobile program provides free:

- Primary care
- Non-emergency care for acute illness
- Episodic and long-term treatment of chronic illnesses (such as diabetes, hypertension, asthma, arthritis, depression, etc.)
- Prenatal care
- Physical therapy
- Prescription medications
- Dental care (primarily fillings and extractions)

Through their network of community partners, patients also receive free:

- Laboratory and blood work
- Imaging services (X-rays, MRIs, etc.)
- A limited number of surgeries

Mission of Mercy does not accept government funding. All funding is provided by private contributions from individuals, foundations, corporations, service organizations, churches, special events, and more.

Mission of Mercy is our November mission focus. You can see what valuable services are provided. When considering your contribution, please remember Jesus' words in Matthew 10:8: "Freely you have received, freely give." Certainly, Mission of Mercy will appreciate your gift.



An Important Message from the Finance Team

We would like to take this opportunity to say **THANK YOU to every family who gives faithfully to support the weekly life changing ministry of our community.** The past years have been financially challenging as well as miraculous. **Please continue your faithful giving for the remaining weeks of 2013 and consider a special gift to kick off support for our Mission Focused Improvement giving campaign.** Though giving is steady this fall we are still tracking about \$6,500 behind our spending. Your faithfulness in these final months will ensure a strong finish to this challenging year.

As we come to the final months of 2013 we are preparing for a very important financial transition next year. As many of you know for the past years we have had a General Ministry Budget which funds our staff, ministries, mortgage and utilities. Your weekly and monthly giving has funded the General Ministry Budget throughout the seasons. Next year an additional Building Fund will be added. Historically we have funded capital expenses exclusively through memorial offerings, special onetime gifts and fund raising events. In 2014 the Vision Team is kicking off a giving campaign to fund much needed repairs to our ministry facilities. You can choose to support this campaign either by giving a designated offering to the Building Fund in celebration of God's provision, or, if you are currently tithing to the general ministry fund, you can go the "second mile" and support this campaign by denoting a "beyond your tithe" gift to the Building Fund.

Our finance team is preparing for this transition by:

- 1. Utilizing faithful stewardship and accounting of general fund giving.
- 2. Inviting all members and friends to covenant to faithful giving.
- 3. Inviting each family to faithfully plan to give generously and regularly in order to fully fund the Mission Focused Improvement Projects through designated offerings, second mile giving and special fund raisers.

The first week of November each family will receive a stewardship celebration packet. Please enjoy the stories and pictures and prayerfully consider how your family is called to partner in the work of God by sharing your financial offerings. We are quite certain that as we each give a faithful a portion of what we have been given, there will be enough to live out God's mission.
