## PASTOR'S ARTICLE **ANCIENT WORDS**

For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide, we might have hope. Romans 15:4

As we move from Spring into Summer, I feel myself becoming weary of the lectionary scriptures. Don't get me wrong, these scriptures are chosen because they succinctly convey the essence of God, the Father, God, the Son, and God, the Holy Spirit. I am feeling a call this Summer to walk the congregation through the Old Testament and how the Old Testament promises are fulfilled through Jesus the Christ.
