It's not the houses we inhabit but the families and the neighborhoods we serve which give us meaning. The purpose of our days is not cleaning houses and paying off mortgages but building relationships with those God has given us to love.

A similar conclusion was reached by our nation 10 years ago in the days following September 11<sup>th</sup>. It was in those grief stricken days that we appreciated the heroes who risk everything in order to serve their community and in which we were reminded how precious it is to have a family or a church to come home to.

This fall as our nation remembers the devastation we will remember God's call for us to be courageous. Not just in the extra-ordinary times when fires rage or buildings fall but also in the everyday moments where tempers jeopardize relationships or decisions form our future.
