Powerful Living

I was heading to the hot tub the other morning and had forgotten to grab a new book to keep me company. I had just finished Logan Isaac's book "God is a Grunt" and I did not want to go into our library and disturb whatever grandchild was asleep in that room. (BTW, our three grandchildren are here for the summer.) So, I grabbed Martin Luther King Jr.'s "Strength to Love", a book that is always on my dresser. I am not sure if it was because my heart was full of Shalom -- we had almost all of our family under one roof for a night, the beauty of the breezes or the

songs of the birds, but King's sermon "Shattered Dreams" hit me like a Mack truck. After reading that sermon I realized just how far I needed to go to write truly life- and thought-changing sermons. In this sermon King used Romans 15: 24 as his launching verse. Paul stated: "Whensoever I take my journey into Spain, I will come to you." You could look at this verse as a throwaway, one of not much consequence, but King made it relative to my life, and I believe I can make it relative to our church and to you. Paul had a dream . . . an ambition to spread the gospel to Spain, the furthest reaches of his known world. He had hoped to get to Spain and then return to Rome to visit his friend. He never got to Spain, but did make it to Rome, albeit in chains. Paul knew that sometimes dreams do not get realized, and yet, he pressed on and turned this disappointed expectation into an opportunity to serve God's purpose. I strongly encourage everyone to read that sermon.

Here at NMUMC a dream has started to percolate, but I (and your leadership team) are not sure if the dream has filtered through the ranks of the congregation. I admit that I think I was the catalyst of this dream, but by the response of the congregation toward the purchase of the Fossett property, I believe that dream has received the confirmation of the Holy Spirit. In Dr. King's sermon, he stated that often in life our reach exceeds our grasp. There have been many dreams born and realized at NMUMC. And yet, there have been defeats too -- where the dream exceeded the grasp of the congregation, for whatever reason. Some of those failures were very hurtful and yet, because of the hurt, shall we cease to dream? "How familiar", King adds, "is the experience of longing for Spain and settling for a Roman prison?" Powerful living is to dream . . . to pursue that dream, even though it may seem beyond our grasp.

I invite the entire congregation to be in prayer and discernment as we listen for where God is leading us in Kingdom-building ways. Much information has been shared and more is in this newsletter. You are encouraged to discuss this with others. If questions arise or you are uncertain about something, give me a call so that I can respond to your questions or concerns.

The next step in this process is to determine whether you, the congregation, support this dream. Your leadership team is preparing another Inquiry Card regarding acquisition of the New Market Cemetery to determine whether the congregation supports this dream and, if so, in what way and to what extent.

Let's not fear to dream God dreams together and not be disappointed if we hear the Holy Spirit say "no", but also, to be prepared heart, mind and spirit if the answer is "go"!





Message from Your Leadership

The improvements to the Fossett Property are planned to be completed in between June and July The leadership teams are currently working on communication to be distributed to the congregation regarding the assuming ownership of the New Market Cemetery. You will receive these communications as soon as they are available.



New Market UMC By the Numbers

For the first time in 2022, the regular offering total for the month (May) did not meet the minimum amount needed to fund the budget. In addition, the online giving was the lowest given in 2022. Information included in the weekly By the Numbers includes information on your giving to *budgeted* categories.

Many unexpected expenses this year were not included when the 2022 budget was approved by the Council in late 2021. Some of the added expense comes from the increased cost of supplies/services due to inflation, as well as a Lenten outreach ministry (and a planned Advent ministry that is similar), bibles for all children's Sunday School participants, \$149/month to provide internet streaming for the video system, repairs to the video system, \$1300 for a new built-in wall oven for the parsonage, assuming the full cost of technology expenses (many of which were previously donated by a family), \$117.08/month to mow the Fossett property, and repair costs to the Schoolhouse HVAC system (that alone cost \$4500+ from the \$5000 budgeted for repairs/maintenance for the year). There is no question about funding these items; however, it would appear that the budget process in coming years must be reevaluated to include contingencies such as these.



Youth Mission Trip- Harrisburg, PA- July 17th - 22nd

Though Harrisburg PA seems to be a flourishing city, there are still significant challenges facing this small urban community.

After filing for bankruptcy in 2011, a variety of strains created negative impacts on the city, including corrupt government leadership, unevenly distributed resources, and a diminishing infrastructure. The community is still on the rise after this significant event in its story. Although there are noticeable improvements to the city since 2011, there

are still neighborhoods within the community that remain

significantly under-resourced. YouthWorks, specifically, invests its summer in the Allison Hill neighborhood, considered to be the most under-resourced neighborhood in Harrisburg. We work with organizations within the community including neighborhood associations, summer camps for children, and community gardens. We also work with outside organizations that help resource the neighborhood like food banks and other local ministries and complete small repair and city beautification projects.
