A Long Obedience in the Same Direction

The quote "A long obedience in the same direction," originally from Friedrich Nietzsche's *Beyond Good and Evil*, describes the necessity of patient, consistent effort toward a goal. Nietzsche was a prominent atheist who famously declared the "death of God," arguing that the concept of God was no longer a viable source of meaning in the modern world . . . a statement that signifies a profound rejection of traditional religious belief and morality in favor of human self-overcoming (a continuous process of self-reflection and elevation). To overcome oneself, one needs to be able to self-evaluate in a critical manner and, most importantly, work on what needs to be worked on and the creation of new values.

Despite this quote's origin, it was popularized in Christian circles by Eugene Peterson for describing Christian discipleship as a faithful, lifelong journey of following Christ, not a series of quick fixes. Peterson used it to emphasize steadfast commitment and spiritual growth through ordinary, consistent actions, making life meaningful.

As a society, we are no less obsessed with the immediate than when Eugene Peterson first wrote this Christian classic. If anything, the advent of email and the Internet may have heightened our desire for instant solutions. But Peterson's time-tested prescription for discipleship remains the same—a long obedience in the same direction. Tucked away in the Hebrew Psalter, Peterson discovered "an old, dog-eared songbook," the Songs of Ascents that were sung by pilgrims on their way to worship in Jerusalem. In these songs (Psalms 120-134), Peterson finds encouragement for modern pilgrims as we learn to grow in worship, service, joy, work, happiness, humility, community, and blessing.

Starting on the first Sunday of January until the end of Lent, I will be exploring these themes of living a disciplined life. I encourage you to purchase the book so that you can more deeply follow the sermon series. The Tuesday morning Bible study will use this book and its study book companion. We invite you to join us at 10:00 AM every Tuesday. There is a saying that many churches are a mile long and an inch deep. I would like to lead us into a discipleship path that is a mile deep and a mile long.
