PASTOR'S NOTE

Jesus replied, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God."

As I write this, our Gospel lectionary reading is focused on Luke 9:51-62. In this passage, Jesus is relating some hard truths about what it means to be a follower of Him. One person has the desire to proclaim, "I will follow you wherever you go." And this is Jesus' reply: "Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head."

He said to another man, "Follow me." But he replied, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father." Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and proclaim the kingdom of God." Still another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me go back and say goodbye to my family." Jesus replied, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God." These statements are confusing until you start to break them down. All of us deeply desire to have a roof over our heads, to know where our next meal will come from, and to know that our homes will make us feel comfortable. I believe that Jesus is relaying to those whose desire is to follow His teachings and practices that it will cost you something. Probably, most of all, your material comforts and things.

It is a natural desire of humanity to want to be comfortable. We have been perfecting comfort for centuries. Our pews are padded, our sanctuaries are conditioned for consistency of temperature, and the sermon messages are designed to be easy to swallow. And yet, Jesus calls us into opportunities of uncomfortableness. He calls us to move from our comfort zones.

because he has a new place and paradigm. He wants us to move toward him. If you had to depend on others' kindness to sleep in safety every night, could you imagine how much your faith in God would grow? to rely on the goodness of others so that you can be fed and hydrated?

There are opportunities for you to serve in your local church, become involved, and step out of your comfort zone from consumption to action. And yet, the response has been unsettlingly quiet. 

VALET PARKING NOW AVAILABLE AT 11:00 A.M. SERVICE

The NMUMC Trustees are aware of the challenges experienced by our limitedmobility congregants to access handicapped parking. This issue will be addressed as the site plan for the New Ministry Center is developed. In the meantime, the option of valet parking for these individuals is being added. To use this option: pull up to the front steps or the handicapped ramp of the sanctuary and turn on the vehicle's flashers. An attendant will park your car after you exit the vehicle and will coordinate a pick-up time with you.

VAL TEAM UPDATE

It is with great excitement that the Val Team voted unanimously to hire Commercial Building Contractors to provide Development Management assistance for the final design stages of the New Ministry Center. Phil Gamble, the owner, provided information on how his company's services could benefit the team with design and cost efficiency. He is now preparing an in-depth cost analysis to determine what the cost of the New Ministry Center will be as currently designed. The team is also developing strategies to provide efficient handicapped parking.

With the growth projected in the next ten years, the team thought it would be helpful to inform the congregation of the new developments planned within the town limits of New Market and the surrounding area. A total of 3,094 new homes/families in the next 10 years!

The developments currently approved are:

New Market Main Street (South side of Route 144 next to the park) -- 42 homes

Lawson's (West end of town) -- 27 homes

England Acres (behind Food Lion, 55+ community)
-- 537 homes

Cherry Run (next to Crickenberger and Green Valley roads) -- 800 homes

Cromwell (Lake Linganore Center, 55+community) -- 488 homes

West Winds (Gas House Pike) -- 1,200 homes

Our goal is to build a New Ministry Center that fulfills the ministry and space needs of the current congregation and prepare for the new residents who will be our neighbors.
