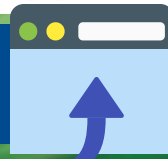

NDA ACTION ALERT

Comments Due: June 26, 2026

- We encourage all current OJP employees, retirees, former federal employees, and supporters to submit comments.
- Your comment can be as simple as: "I oppose the proposed rule," and you can do so anonymously.
- Submit comments through the [Federal Register's Confidential Government Information Nondisclosure Agreement](#).
- Every comment becomes part of the official rulemaking record and must be reviewed by the government.
- A high volume of comments sends a clear message that federal employees are paying attention and expect their rights and protections to be preserved.

Labor Fact:

Union contracts remain enforceable unless and until they are lawfully terminated, modified, or superseded through applicable legal processes.

Proposed Government-Wide NDA Open for Public Comment

The Office of Personnel Management (OPM) has proposed a government-wide Confidential Government Information Nondisclosure Agreement (NDA) that it could require current and future federal employees to sign. The proposal would establish a standardized NDA across federal agencies and broadly define what information employees may not disclose. Federal unions and whistleblower advocates have raised concerns that the proposal could discourage employees from disclosing waste, fraud, abuse, mismanagement, or other workplace concerns, despite existing legal protections, including the [Whistleblower Protection Act of 1989](#).

We believe any policy affecting employee rights, workplace communications, transparency, and accountability deserves scrutiny. The Union plans to submit comments on the proposed rule and encourages all employees to make their voices heard. Comments are due by **June 26, 2026**. Submitting a comment becomes part of the official rulemaking record.

AFSCME Local 2830 will submit comments and continue to monitor this proposal and provide updates as they become available.
