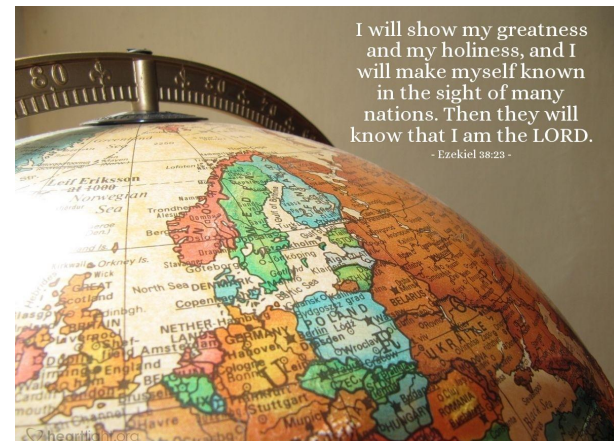
NO SCHOOL/OFFICE CLOSED- There is no school on **Friday, October 27, 2023**. The office will be closed.
