


Greeting Families and Supporters,

This past weekend, I held a community event program for Opioid Awareness here at the school. A family (whose child is a student at one of our four association church schools) at the event asked me "why the students from their child's school do not all attend Wolf River for their high school?" I told them that it was my goal to have our four elementary school families continue their educational journey at Wolf River. I shared how we had 67 8th-grade students visit in January, and the majority of students did not enroll at Wolf River. The mom said it would be amazing if one-third of the students from all the association church schools came to Wolf River for that would be about 20 students. I told her that would be amazing!! I further shared that when I meet with the students at the four elementary schools, the majority of students have been at their respective schools since preschool. As we look at our enrollment, I am thrilled that we have 23 students currently enrolled, but my goal is to grow the school and the only way to make this happen is to recruit and share the school with our community. So, I challenge you to talk to your family, your friends, and your neighbors, and encourage them to tour Wolf River. I love giving tours and sharing about this amazing place!
