TRACK NEWS - Thursday, April 11th we competed in the first meet of the year at Bowler. This was the first year Bowler hosted a meet since 2010 (which we competed in at that time, and brings back memories of our alumni). This year's meet was an outstanding start to our season, with the boys placing second out of five teams and the girls placing fourth. Both are fantastic results considering the number of athletes we had competing. We had multiple events with athletes placing in scoring positions. Of note were second place finishes by Em in the 100m, Violet in the 1600m and triple jump, and Julia and Brad in the discus. We had first place finishes by Gunner in the 1600m and Violet in the 3200m (who broke our 3200m school record in her first race). The boys sprint relay of Ryan, Brad, Rylan and Gunner also placed first and was perhaps the most exciting event of the night. Gunner was our anchor leg and received the baton being in second place by about 50m.
