Happy New Year! As we begin a new year at Christ Lutheran Church, I am excited that we as a congregation are continuing with services, events, and traditions, even while looking for a new pastor. So far, I feel that we are becoming a closer-knit church family. So, if you have not been to church lately, please come and help make us a stronger family.

While January begins a new calendar year, in the Church, it starts out in the middle of the Christmas season and ends in the middle of the Epiphany season. These are the second and third seasons of the Church Year. From Concordia Publishing House, I found the following about Epiphany and its season on a poster about the Christian Church Year for 2023:

Epiphany begins with the evening prayer on January 5

and ends the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday (Fat Tuesday or Mardi Gras). It is one of the oldest seasons in the Church Year, second only to the Easter season. This season of lights emphasizes Jesus' manifestation (or epiphany) as God and man. The earliest Christians called the feast of Epiphany the Theophany ("revelation of God"). When the Gentile Magi came to worship Jesus, they show that now everyone has access to God. Now all people, Jew, Gentile, can come to God's temple to worship, because Jesus is the new temple: God in the flesh. The Epiphany of our Lord (Jan. 6) marks the celebration of the visit of the Magi. During the season, there are two important feasts of Christ marking the beginning and the end. On the first Sunday after Epiphany, the Church celebrates the Baptism of

our Lord. The last Sunday of Epiphany is the Feast of Transfiguration, a uniquely Lutheran contribution to the Christian calendar. This festival commemorates the moment on the Mount of Transfiguration when three of Jesus' disciples glimpsed their Lord in divine splendor, seeing Him as the center of the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah). Jesus proclaims to his disciple, then and now, that He is the long-awaited one who has come to die for the sins of the world and be raised again in glory.

Weekly Evangelism Challenge Verses



Week of January 1, 2024 - Proverbs 11:30-31

"The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life, and whoever captures souls is wise.

If the righteous is repaid on earth, how much more the wicked and the sinner!"

Week of January 8, 2024 - Mark 1:16-18

"Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men."

And immediately they left their nets and followed him."

Week of January 15, 2024 - Acts 17:29-34

"Being then God's offspring, we ought not to think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of man.

The times of ignorance God overlooked, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.

Now when they heard of the resurrection of the dead, some mocked. But others said, "We will hear you again about this." So Paul went out from their midst. But some men joined him and believed, among whom also were Dionysius the Areopagite and a woman named Damaris and others with them.

Week of January 22, 2024 - 2 Corinthians 5:10-17

"For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil.

Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we persuade others.

But what we are is known to God, and I hope it is known also to your conscience. We are not commending ourselves to you again but giving you cause to boast about us, so that you may be able to answer those who boast about outward appearance and not about what is in the heart.

For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you. For the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised.

From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come."

Week of January 29, 2024 - Acts 18:5-11

"When Silas and Timothy arrived from Macedonia, Paul was occupied with the word, testifying to the Jews that the Christ was Jesus. And when they opposed and reviled him, he shook out his garments and said to them, "Your blood be on your own heads! I am innocent. From now on I will go to the Gentiles."

And he left there and went to the house of a man named Titius Justus, a worshiper of God. His house was next door to the synagogue. Crispus, the ruler of the synagogue, believed in the Lord, together with his entire household. And many of the Corinthians hearing Paul believed and were baptized.

And the Lord said to Paul one night in a vision, "<u>Do not be afraid, but go on speaking and do not be silent, for I am with you, and no one will attack you to harm you, for I have many in this city who are my people</u>." And he stayed a year and six months, teaching the word of God among them."
