The Third Commandment teaches us about the Sabbath:

"Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." The Law of Moses then lays out all the ways in which this is to occur: most of it about not working on the Sabbath. It was, first and foremost, a day of rest. The first Sabbath command to the Israelites was that they were not to collect manna from the ground in the wilderness on that day, the miraculous food God was giving to them. Every other day, they had to go out and collect it; it would spoil by the next day, so every morning that had to get up and trust God to provide. Only on the day before Sabbath could they collect double, and only that day would it remain unspoiled. Mirroring the seven days of Creation, God lays out for them a rhythm of work and rest, and always trusting Him through it all.



But from the beginning, the Sabbath was not about merely refraining from work for one day a week, as necessary as it is to rest our bodies. It was always about worship too: "You shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the LORD your God brought you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore, the LORD your God commanded you to keep the Sabbath day," Deuteronomy 5:15. The command to keep the Sabbath is bound up together with remember the salvation of God. And so, the catechism explains it, "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

What kind of rest do you need? Jesus says, "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your

souls." God is immensely concerned for our well-being. He tells us to rest one day a week, to trust Him to provide for us instead of frantically working on our own. He tells us to come to Him, and let Him bear our spiritual burdens because there is no hope for us to bear them on our own. When we are yoked together with Christ, we find true rest, true relief, true peace.

When we make work or money or possessions into an idol, we trust our hands and our effort to provide for our needs. God calls us to trust Him instead as the source of all good and necessary things, even as He teaches us to pray "give us this day our daily bread." He calls us back to Himself, so He can give to us both our daily bread here and now, and the Bread of Life in Jesus for life everlasting. So, rest easy in the care of God in Christ, and come to receive His gifts of faith.

- Shawn Robbins gave a presentation at the June Men's Prayer Breakfast on active shooter situations in churches. This prompted discussions on other aspects of responding to violent events such as verbal deescalation, first aid response, and evacuation of the facilities. As a result of these discussions, we have identified folks who are willing to respond as needed. We have someone who will try to verbally deescalate an event, stop violence, and provide first aid until EMS arrives. Pastor, Kyndel, and Jay will assist in evacuation of the Sanctuary through the vestry. Kyndel and the nursery attendant will be the primary 911 callers. If anyone else is interested in helping, please notify me, Pastor, or Shawn.
- Kevin is actively researching AEDs and Mass Trauma Casualty kits.
