As this month brings with it our annual day of Thanksgiving, it is perhaps the one

occasion each year when many Americans are bit self-reflective about the blessings we have. It is an excellent thing that our nation has this tradition, even one day a year having a public call to be grateful for what we have. But I've noticed that for many people, this takes the form of nothing more than a generic, nonspecific feeling of thankfulness. To truly give thanks, though, we need to have a clear idea of who we are thanking for it: that is, of course, the Lord our God who created everything and continues to sustain and bless His entire Creation. I appreciate these words of Martin Luther, with his signature turn of phrase:

Great are the works of the Lord; they are pondered by all who delight in them. Psalm 111:2

"The works of the Lord are great. But in this passage, the psalmist points out that only a few devout people notice what God has done. Most people don't praise God or thank him. They never say, 'Great are the works of the Lord.' Though they are completely surrounded by his gifts, they have gotten used to them. They take advantage of what God has given them, rooting around in God's gifts like a hog in a bag of feed. They say, 'What's so special about the fact that the sun shines, fire gives warmth, the ocean provides fish, the earth yields grain, cows have calves, women give birth the children, and hens lay eggs? These things happen every day!'

"Is something insignificant just because it happens every day? If the sun wouldn't shine for ten days, suddenly it would be a great thing when it began shining again. If fire existed only in one place on the earth, I think it would be more precious than gold or silver. If there were only one well in the world, I would imagine that a drop of water would be worth more than a thousand dollars.

"God showers people with rich and wonderful blessings. But how ungrateful and blind people are! They don't recognize these blessings as amazing miracles from God, so they don't admire them, give thanks for them, or act happy about them. However, if a clown can walk on a tightrope or train monkeys, people are ready to admire and praise him for it. The psalmist points out that the Lord's works are great, but these works are appreciated only in the eyes of God's faithful followers."

So let us indeed be thankful people, grateful to our gracious Lord who does daily and richly provide for us and bless us. Even in this year, which has admittedly been stressful for most of us, let our praise and thanksgiving always outweigh this world's troubles.

Elder (Jody) - basically working with 3 elders as T. J. & Dave H. Are out due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Trustees (Jerold Shepherd) Next project is to replace lights in the altar room and hallway in the Fellowship hall. Still need to replace three metal doors in the Fellowship hall.

Financial Secretary: (Carl Erichsen) Total contributions for September: \$7626, October so far: \$ 6065 Hurricane relief: \$1105 YTD: 99371.32 + we have received 1035.97 through PayPal. YTD total including PayPal contributions= 100407.29

Treasurer (Lin Jacobson): collections have been steady; \$2693.03 checking account balance; all bills paid; one additional salary payment to Pastor due end of the month. Council discussed resuming contributions to the district. Lin will make a contribution of \$500. We agreed to a goal of quarterly contributions next year of \$350.

Mary Martha: Collecting gift cards for hurricane relief. Purchase gift cards such as VISA, Target, Walmart, and turn in to Mary Martha members by December 6th. Mary Martha received a Thrivent grant which will be used to bring brownies to local first responders. If you are baking brownies, please bring Nov 1. Nativity Walk this year is canceled.

Membership, Worship, and Christian Education

- Membership changes: none

- No changes with our Sunday morning plans at the moment. We've averaged 35-45 in the sanctuary each week, still with the alternate pew distancing and everyone wearing masks. As we sometimes approach 50, are we willing to consider opening up more pews?

- In Sunday morning Bible class, we have finished the new TV show The Chosen based on the Gospels and will be moving on to something new; first, a short 3-part series on Christian citizenship, then possibly The Story. I am still posting a weekly Bible study video online.



- As far as post-worship fellowship, there's a pot of coffee in case anyone wants to come in, but not many people have come over so far.

- Oktoberfest on Oct. 18 was great! We had about 40 people stay, and the weather for holding it outside was beautiful; the consensus seems that we ought to keep having it outdoors in the future, if weather permits.

- Search for an additional organist: we are thankful for Rita and Tanya's service, but they'd appreciate some relief if we can find another organist to help out!

Mission, Witness, and Outreach

- The online services are a good outreach tool! I encourage everyone to share these on your own pages, as some of you already have. The services stay available after the initial premiere, so anyone can go back and watch older ones too.

Circuit, District, and Synod

- For the foreseeable future, we are holding our monthly circuit meetings online via Zoom.

- Gary Weier is coming to the term-limited end of his service as circuit visitor, and I have been elected to take his place beginning in summer 2021.

Travel

- Vacation time to date for 2020: 13 days used out of 24 total (0 Sundays out of 3).

- Planned travel in October: no travel, but I took a couple of days off when family were visiting us here.

- Planned travel in November: with approval from the elders, we will again visit family in Tennessee for

Thanksgiving as they cover the Thanksgiving Eve service.

Other Activities, General Information

- Eve is on the board of directors of a new group to start a community theatre for Pascagoula. As their first fundraiser event, they are discussing a dramatic reading of "A Christmas Carol" in December, and we wondered about using our fellowship hall as the venue.

- Possible fellowship activity: movie theatre in d'Iberville is offering private showings for a group up to 20, with a lot of options for the movie.
