# Christ Lutheran Church, Pascagoula, MS



"For he satisfies the longing soul, and the hungry soul he fills with good things," says Psalm

107:9. Or "I am the LORD your God, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt. Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it," says Psalm 81:10. The Magnificat in Luke chapter 1 also says "He has filled the hungry with good things." There's nothing that I think of more in November than Thanksgiving, and nothing more for Thanksgiving than the great feast we always enjoy. With our extended family all gathering together, in recent years we've had around twenty people all cramming around the table for the delicious spread and the centerpiece, an enormous turkey. And after that meal, we are most certainly filled with good things.

These verses of Scripture do talk about our physical needs; as Jesus himself reminds us, God knows what our needs are in this life and teaches us to trust Him and pray to Him for those things. He is a loving and generous Father who delights in the world He has made, us and our bodily needs included. Yet Jesus also tells us to, first and foremost, seek his Kingdom; that is, be faithful to him and prioritize the things of eternal life over the transient things of this life.

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied," Jesus teaches in the Beatitudes. He calls himself the Bread of Life and the source of Living Water. He offers spiritual nourishment; he gives himself to us to feed us, sustain us, energize us for the true life and true work of the Kingdom of God. He promises not a lengthening of our life in this present, fallen world, but a new life in a new Creation defined by that righteousness and peace of God.

The Psalm says, "Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it." We open our mouths in thanksgiving for God's gifts of food and family and fellowship, and may we be filled with these. We open our mouths in thanksgiving for God's eternal gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation in Christ, and we are filled to overflowing. We are filled up and satisfied, and we overflow, the words of his grace filling our mouths as we share the good news. Some of you may not feel particularly thankful or filled around the table this year: family who are absent or separated for all kinds of reasons, difficulties in life and work and health that cast a shadow, financial difficulties that make the feast a little less splendid that you'd like. But in all circumstances and at all times, we are still thankful and joyful to be filled with the righteousness of Christ, the hunger and thirst that Jesus satisfies; to be nourished to overflowing in the needs of our souls and the life that will never end. So indeed, "he satisfies the longing soul, and the hungry soul he fills with good things."
