How might the church be best equipped to confess the faith in and throughout this culture with the transforming power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ?

May this year be an exciting and thoughtful time of engaging culture, scripture, and other confessions of the church as we examine these questions together.

Long-term Strategic Imperatives

Long-Term Strategic Imperatives: In April of 2018, the congregation adopted the following long-term (five year) strategic imperatives for the congregation. These imperatives flowed from two consecutive years of work including; yearly Epiphany mission conversations with members of the congregation and community, focused study groups within the congregation, and several leadership meetings. Below is a listing of these imperatives along with the responsible board.

Congregational Care and Community

- *Continue enriching ongoing lay leader development.
- *Grow small groups and ministry teams. 75% of all congregation members will be involved in a small group or ministry team by year-end 2020.

Education and Spiritual Formation

- *Form and/or partner with a separate organization (non/not for profit), to provide licensed day-care and/or pre-school, that will be operational by year-end 2020.
- *Continue to enhance and grow youth/children's ministry participation by 10% by year-end 2020. We will seek to maintain a key component of total family involvement in this ministry.

Service and Evangelism

- *Enhance our partnership with the NE MN Synod of the ELCA to include the School of Lay Ministry (Missional Lay Leadership).
- *Enhance and deepen our current community partnerships. We will broaden our current nineteen partnerships to twenty-five by year-end 2020.
- *Boldly proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God through word and service.

Stewardship and Property

- *Continue to advance financial stewardship throughout the congregation. This will include: teaching on first-fruits giving and tithing, timely communication regarding the greater work of the congregation including success stories and current challenges and presenting opportunities for giving and serving in other capacities that engage God's mission for the sake of the world.
- *Deepen the understanding of stewardship through our daily callings in the life of God's world.

Worship and Music

- *Increase weekly worship attendance by 10% by year-end 2020.
- *50% of our members will be worshiping regularly each week by 2022.



One Year Bible Reading Challenge



As we consider our annual theme, "confessing the faith in a secular age," how will we know what or how to confess? How will we know God's story throughout history that is brought to fulfillment in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ for the sake of God's world? We will not adequately know or be proficiently equipped, unless we take seriously our study of scripture. Over the next year, I am challenging our congregation to engage in a daily reading of scripture. In Paul's second letter to Timothy, "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work." (2 Timothy 3:16-17). I would encourage you to lean into the daily discipleship practice of reading scripture either by yourself, or better yet, gather with another (or others) to read/discuss together. Find a "bible study buddy" to check in with once a week to see how things are going and talk about what you are reading. Check out our website or newsletter each month for daily readings beginning with Genesis on September 15th, 2019 and concluding on September 14th of 2020 with Revelation. To further aid you in this endeavor, I would recommend visiting the website www.enterthebible.org which is provided by Luther Seminary in St. Paul. MN. This is an excellent resource to utilize as you are reading. You will find online videos, maps, historical information, etc, for every book in the Bible ... best of all, it's free to utilize. To log on, simple create an account and password, then you are all ready to go!



Faith Formation in a Secular Age by Andrew Root



Join us at Bethlehem as we welcome the Rev. Dr. Andrew Root, professor of Youth and Family Ministry, co-sponsored by the NE MN Synod's Lay Leader Network and NE MN Synod's Men's Ministry.

Andrew Root joined Luther Seminary in 2005. He is often mentioned as one of the leading scholars in youth ministry and practical theology in the world. His first book *Revisiting Relational Ministry* (IVP, 2007) presented a new trajectory for youth ministry, offering the field one of the first robust theological projects. Since then, Root has published sixteen books, many of which have been found on lists for book of year. His 2011 book, *The Theological Turn in Youth Ministry*, was awarded Book of Merit by *Christianity Today*.

Root has also offered important texts on pastoral ministry more generally, asserting that "the theological substance of youth ministry is no different than ministry generally; my concern is to discuss how real people (whether young or old) experience the living presence of God." His books *The Promise of Despair, The Relational Pastor,* and *Christopraxis* have all offered new visions for pastoral practice and practical theology. Root's unique theological project is to see all of theology through the lens of ministry, particularly exploring God's own act and being as fundamentally ministry. From 2015 to 2018, Root was the principal leader for a 1.2 million dollar John Templeton

Root's latest project is a three volume series with Baker Academic called "Ministry in a Secular Age." Volume one was released as *Faith Formation in a Secular Age* in October 2017. Volume two, titled *The Pastor in a Secular Age*, was released in late spring 2019, with volume three to follow. In this series, Root uses Charles Taylor's thought to explore the challenges of ministry, offering a theological and ministerial response. Root is known as a leading thinker on the thought of Charles Taylor, secularity, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, modernity, science and ministry, pastoral theology, practical theology, and youth ministry.

Andrew Root is a sought-after speaker at conferences, colleges, and churches. He is known for an engaging style that laces together stories, theological depth, and humor. He has lectured and presented all over the world, including South Africa, New Zealand, Australia, and throughout Europe.

All Church Mission Trip


