
Lay Leader Network Yearly Intensive Series





One way is by planting a 180' x 30' shoreline buffer of native plants to reduce erosion and runoff into the lake. They also put a brick in the toilet tank in one bathroom to reduce water usage and have a reduced flush toilet in another bathroom. In addition, they reuse plastic bags or use their own reusable bags for groceries, have LED lighting, use a 3 bin composting system, and have dual fuel and off-peak heating and hot water. They are in the habit of turning off lights when they leave a room. Their garden provides many of their garden provides many of their

vegetables, some of which are organic. They recycle. Buying and using glass containers instead of plas-

tic cuts down on their waste. They have two rain barrels and hang clothes on the clothesline to dry when weather permits. Finally they make and use their own window washing and cleaning solutions.



CREATION CARE

Canada, following the example of the European O Union, voted recently to ban 10 single-use plastics that most often end up in the ocean, including R plastic cutlery, plates, and cotton-swab sticks. More than 8 million tons of plastic are dumped into the world's oceans every year, currently Ν totaling 50 million tons of plastic that is being ingested by at least 331 species of animals. Ε According to the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, by 2050 99% of all seabird species will have consumed plastic, leading to R suffering from obstructions, stomach ruptures and starvation. While the US ranks 20th worldwide for producing plastic marine debris, the US has long been the world's biggest exporter of plastic waste to the poorer countries lacking waste management that generate nearly 60% of plastic pollution. US industry interests also benefit from selling plastics and products packed in non-recyclable plastic to developing countries, according to the Center for Oceanic Awareness, Research, and Education. URGE OUR LEADERS to be part of a shared global commitment to significantly reduce or phase out sing-use plastic, and pledge to do so yourself.
