



## CREATION CARE

Minnesota Power and Xcel Energy (Minnesota's largest utility) have operated fossil-fuel power plants for decades, generating millions of tons of carbon pollution that have played a part in making Minnesota one of the fastest-warming states. In addition, thousands of tons of sulfur dioxide and mercury have polluted Minnesota's lakes and rivers, and have triggered respiratory illnesses. Xcel has said it is going to be 100% carbon free by 2050, and

has converted major coal plants in Minneapolis and St. Paul to natural gas, often considered a "bridge" fossil fuel between coal and renewables. Yet Xcel's proposed new gas plant in Becker has just been dropped after research from their own studies showed that cheaper renewable energy would make the plant a "stranded asset" (unable to capitalize on a shuttered plant) long before its 40-year lifespan plays out. The science is clear on climate change as well as on the economics of energy production.

Thank you for your \$564.50 donation to our "I am the Bread of Life" campaign.
