Scripture Reading: Liturgist: Eric Hanson

Liturgist: We now turn our hearts and minds to the reading of God's Holy Scripture found in the Gospel of John, chapter 6, verses 24-35 where we hear Jesus declare that he is the bread of life for all who long to follow him.

Let us pray: Holy God, on this Thanksgiving Sunday, we are reminded of all the blessings we have received from you – the most important of them all – our Savior Jesus who is the bread of life for our hungry souls. Be with us now as we hear him promise us spiritual nourishment all the days of our lives. Amen.

Read John 6: 24-35 (found on page 98 of the pew Bible)

It was now the day after Jesus had performed the miracles of feeding 5000 people from just two fishes and five loaves of bread and then later walked on water to the boat where the disciples had been sitting in to get away from the crowds. Their boat had quietly reached its destination on the other side of the sea.

The crowds realized that they had been left behind – so they piled into other boats and headed for Capernaum - looking for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" And Jesus replied, "You've come looking for me not because you saw the presence of God in my actions – but because I fed you and you filled your stomachs for free."

"Listen," he told them, "Do not waste your energy striving for food that perishes like that. Instead, work for the food that endures – that sticks with you - food that nourishes your eternal life that the Son of Man provides. He and what he does are guaranteed by God to last."

To that they said, "Well, what must we do to perform the works of God?" And Jesus replied, "This is the work of God – that you believe in the One whom he sent and follow his ways."

So, they asked, "What will you do to prove to us who you are so that we might believe and follow you. Show us what you can do. Moses fed our ancestors with bread in the desert. It says so in the Scriptures: 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'"

Then Jesus explained to them, "The real significance of that Scripture is not that Moses gave you bread from heaven but that my Father is right now offering you real bread from heaven - food for your soul that will endure. For the bread of God is that which has come down from heaven and is giving life to the world."

The people said, "Master, give us this bread, now and forever!"

Jesus said, "I am the Bread of Life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."
