Lighting of the Advent Wreath: The Candle of JoyLed by lan & Missy Hayes

Let us pray together: O Holy One, as Christmas draws near, we feel the excitement of this special time of the year with joy in our hearts. Help us to share this joy with those around us wherever we go. May it spread throughout the whole world so that your gifts of hope and peace and joy will be felt by all people. Amen.

Scripture Reading: Liturgist: Todd Sutter

Liturgist: We now turn our hearts and minds to the reading of God's Holy Scripture. Today's reading comes from the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke, verses 26-38 where we hear the story of the announcement to Mary that she will be the mother of God.

Read Luke 1: 26-38 (found on page 56 of the Pew Bible)

Scripture Reading: Luke 1: 26-38 (page 56 of the Pew Bible)

In the sixth month following the announcement by the angel Gabriel that Elizabeth would bear a son, that same angel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth. There he appeared to a virgin named Mary who was engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David.

The angel said to her, "Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be.

Then he told her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus.

He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God.

And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God."

Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.
