Call To Worship:

Advent Candle Lighting Ceremony:

Pastor: Rejoice and be glad! All: The season of Advent is upon us!

Pastor: A reading from Psalm 85, verses 8-13.

Let me hear what God the Lord will speak, for he will speak peace to his people, to his faithful, to those who turn to him in their hearts. Surely his salvation is at hand for those who fear him, that his glory may dwell in our land. Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet; righteousness and peace will kiss each other. Faithfulness will spring up from the ground, and righteousness will look down from the sky. The Lord will give what is good, and our land will yield its increase. Righteousness will go before him, and will make a path for his steps.

Pastor: This is the word of the Lord. All: Thanks be to God.

Light the First Candle. Pastor: Every day many people suffer due to war, disease, poverty, and injustice. They are longing for a place where "righteousness and peace will kiss each other". This Advent season – listen! God's voice is speaking peace to each of those who are faithful. Listen – we are the ones called by god to show his love and care and compassion to those in need.

All: We believe n a God who speaks peace to all peoples. We pray for the day when peace and good will toward all will be the way of the world.

Light the Second Candle. Pastor: Rejoice always! All: The Child of Peace is coming!

Sung Response: Sung to the tune of "Breathe On Me, Breath of God"

Kindle this flame of peace, May it burn bright and true. Lighting the way that is of God, the journey we pursue.

Prayer for Advent:

A message is sent to prepare the way for someone special to come and something amazing to happen – something life-changing for the people who hear the message. Let us pray for such ears and hearts together - Loving God, John the Baptist cried out in the wilderness for people to get ready for the arrival of the Messiah.
