5. Kicking Horse Pedestrian Bridge

The Kicking Horse Pedestrian Bridge is the longest freestanding timber frame bridge in Canada. Built in 2001 from locally sourced timbers, and with Swiss design reflecting the heritage of the Swiss Guides in Golden, the bridge spans the Kicking Horse River in downtown Golden. Cyclists and walkers cross continuously, and in the summer rafts pass underneath on the final stretch of their thrilling whitewater rafting trip.



6. Cedar Lake

Cedar Lake is a small wilderness lake accessed via a gravel road on the way to Kicking Horse Mountain Resort. This offers camping and day-use with picnic sites, parking, and toilet facilities.

In summer Cedar Lake is also a popular location for hiking and mountain biking and has a beach for families to enjoy swimming and picnicking. The Moonraker Trail system, offering over 50 km of recreational trails, is accessible from the campground.

9. Kinbasket Lake

Kinbasket Lake is a reservoir on the Columbia River and spans 260 km. The water levels can drastically vary depending on the month but it has great fishing for bull trout, ling cod, rainbow, kokanee and whitefish and several boat launch spots which makes it popular with locals. Accessed by forestry roads off the Trans-Canada Highway 1, west of Golden.



10. Columbia River

The Columbia River is designated a B.C. Heritage River. It is the largest river in the Pacific Northwest region of North America, and the fourth largest river by volume in North America. The river rises from its headwaters near Canal Flats in the Canadian Rocky Mountains of British Columbia. Its source is Columbia Lake at 2,690 ft above sea level. From here it flows approximately 2,000km northwest through Golden to Revelstoke, and then south into the US



11. Gorman Lake Hke (Moderate)

Hike to a beautiful alpine lake through a forest, across a boggy section with boardwalks and a climb through a rock field. Watch for wildlife including grizzly and black bears, particularly in the late summer and fall. The lake is stocked with rainbow trout. There is no cell phone reception along most of the road, so it is critical you are prepared accordingly. Only experienced hikers should venture to this lake.



12. Worlds Largest Paddle

Take a walk back to the early days of the area when David Thompson, a surveyor for the North West Company, arrived in the Columbia Valley to set up a trading post, where he could trade with the indigenous people and continue mapping the surrounding area.
