EMERGENCY DECLARATION

HIGH EXCESSIVE RAINFALL

WHEREAS, The Mayor of the City of Ivanhoe, Texas, on the 29th day of April, 2024, issued an Emergency Declaration beginning at 7:00 a.m. and if needed beyond seven days must be continued in effect by vote of City Council.

WHEREAS, the Mayor of Ivanhoe, Texas, has determined, based upon the heavy rainfall event, a state of emergency has been declared. This event has rendered many roadways impassable due to fast high running water resulting in many residents being unable to ingress or egress their homes or the city.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF IVANHOE, TEXAS:

I. That a local state of disaster is hereby declared for the City of Ivanhoe, Texas, pursuant to Section 418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code.

II. Pursuant to Section 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, the state of disaster shall remain in effect until rescinded by the Mayor of the City of Ivanhoe, Texas and/or the County of Tyler rescinds the burn ban for Tyler County.

III. Pursuant to Section 418. of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.

IV. Pursuant to Section 418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, the declaration of a local state of disaster activates the Emergency Management Plan.

IIII. Pursuant to Section 418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, the declaration of a local state of disaster activates the Emergency Management Plan.
