Agenda Item #4 - Mayor's Report

- The city received a letter from TCEQ's Dam Safety Program saying that the city's application for High Hazard Dam Rehabilitation grant has received preliminary approval for \$405,000 with a 35% city matching fund for a total of \$263,000. The application has been sent to FEMA for a final review. The original request from the mayor was \$300,000.
- The Texas GLO has \$136 million of Hurricane Harvey and Hurricane Ike funds not yet awarded. If awarded any of these funds, they would be used to rebuild 28th Street in its entirety.
- The electrical pole in the middle of Mill Creek at Sir Jim Drive, and in the city's right-of-way, continues to be a conflict and is delaying construction. Entergy wants to charge the city to move the pole even though the 1963 Platte clearly shows that the pole is in the city's 60-foot right-of-way. The mayor has filed a complaint with the Public Utility Commission and was told that the city would have to file a formal legal complaint which would be very time-consuming. The city's grant administration has approved the use of grant funds to move the pole so that construction can continue.
- The hump on Ivanhoe Drive near the entrance is due to 24" culvert installation. Originally, it was 36" culverts. Tyler County has a \$1.2 million grant to rebuild Ivanhoe Drive from Camelot Drive to Charmaine Drive East. If there are funds remaining, they will be used to finish rebuilding Charmaine Dive East. The city's contractor will be rebuilding Ivanhoe Drive from US 69 to Camelot Drive and will be raised to match the current culvert hump.
- A pre-construction meeting will be held tomorrow to discuss the layout of Lakewood Dr. The contractor selected to rebuild Lakewood Dr. from Camelot Dam to Galahad Dam and Galahad Dam to Tristan Dam with a 4" limestone base and 2" asphalt.
- There are issues with cracks on Camelot Circle and 22nd issues. It appears that Texas Materials base installed improperly. The longer it takes for Texas Materials to repair the issues and until the city signs off on completion, the longer the warranty will be in effect. This was a \$200,000 mistake on the part of Texas Materials.

• Culverts are being installed throughout the city by Public Works. By Public Works performing culvert installation and ditch work is allowing more money to be spent on road construction.

B. Dams

- Lake Charmaine is being lowered to dry out the spillway and spilling basin so Marsh Waterproofing can finish caulking the dam. Marsh Waterproofing missed one seam and there is area at the toe that needs to be caulked.
- GPR on Galahad Dam was conducted on October 28, 2024. The city is waiting for the data analysis report.
- Epoxy Designs performed a walk-thru of Charmaine and Galahad Dams and will drill bore holes after the data analysis report is received.
