The Coin That Never Was: The 1964-D Peace Dollar

Greetings Coin Enthusiasts,

Most collectors know the Peace Dollar series ended in 1935, but few realize that nearly 30 years later the U.S. Mint attempted to bring it back. In 1964, Congress authorized the production of over 45 million new silver dollars to address a coin shortage in the western United States, where casinos and banks still relied heavily on dollar coins.

The Denver Mint began striking the new coins in May 1965. Although no examples were officially released, Mint records indicate that **316,076 1964-D Peace Dollars** were struck. Almost immediately, controversy erupted. Collectors, speculators, and government officials feared the coins would be hoarded for their silver content rather than circulate. Public criticism grew, and Congress quickly reversed course.

The Treasury Department ordered all 1964-D Peace Dollars melted before they could leave the Mint. Officially, every coin was destroyed, and no specimen is legally permitted to exist. Yet rumors have persisted for decades that one or more examples may have escaped destruction. Despite numerous searches and investigations, no authenticated specimen has ever surfaced.

If a genuine 1964-D Peace Dollar were discovered today, it would instantly become one of the most important and valuable U.S. coins ever found. Its combination of rarity, mystery, and historical significance has made it one of the great "what if" stories in American numismatics—a coin that was struck, counted, and then erased from history.
