Heirloom Recipe Corner

Crisscross Peanut Butter Cookies

PRE-HEAT OVEN TO 375° F

1 C. Salted Butter

1 C. Crunchy Peanut Butter

1 C. Sugar

1 C. Light Brown Sugar

2 Eggs

BAKE 10 TO 12 MINUTES

2 1/2 C. Flour

1 tea. Baking Powder

1 ½ tea. Baking Soda

1/2 tea. Salt

Mix butter, peanut butter, sugars, & eggs thoroughly. In a separate bowl, blend all dry ingredients. Stir dry mixture into butter mixture.

Roll dough in 1 ¼ inch balls. Place 3 inches apart on parchment lined cookie sheets. Use a fork dipped in sugar to flatten the cookie making a crisscross pattern.

YEILDS: 5 DOZEN

Valid Facts Every CHRNA Member Needs to Know

CHRNA IS NOT an average Homeowners Association and Crownwoodies like it that way!

FACT #1: Membership in CHRNA is voluntary, inclusive, and a positive decision for anyone living in Crownwood.

If someone has negative feelings that keep them from joining, it is usually rooted from experience or knowledge of negative actions of Mandatory HOAs. The primary focus of these types of organizations is their "bottom line." Prompt on time payment of dues and the collection of fines because of an infraction against their covenants is so important that they use a large portion of the money collect to fund retainers for an attorney who mostly writes letters to residents to enforce payment of dues and fines. If you ask a resident living in one of these type of neighborhoods about the structure of their association, a majority will not know. Many have no idea how the funds supplied by them through the form of dues is spent. Most of those you ask have no idea who the President of their association is or if there is even a Board. Congratulate those neighbors who say they moved into Crownwood because there was not a mandatory HOA, because they made the right decision.

FACT #2: CHRNA IS RIGHT FOR CROWNWOOD! CHRNA MEMBERS...

- A) ...are informed about Bexar County events and projects that will enhance or detract from the living environment of the community at meetings held every other month.
- B) ...are provided information in writing provided through Crownwood E-News sent each month via email.
- C) ...who have been active for a minimum of six months are direct beneficiaries of the CHRNA Benevolent Fund designed to provide financial assistance in the case of a catastrophic loss.
- D) ...who attend a minimum of two meetings are eligible to run for an office on the CHRNA Board. The term for each elected members is one year with no term limits.
- E) ...participate annually in an in-person secret ballot election for the CHRNA Board that will serve the following year.

FACT #3: Is based on CHRNA's current membership numbers.



Less than 10% of Crownwood Residents are actively making decisions that affect 100% of Crownwood.

Ask your neighbor, *if they are comfortable with that?* Remind them that the CHRNA Board is recognized as representatives for ALL OF Crownwood, member or not.

It is never too late to jump onboard with CHRNA! The most important decision a Crownwoodie can make is to become an active member.

CRIME PREVENTION BEGINS AT HOME



Three (3) factors must be present for a crime to occur: Desire, Ability & Opportunity. The following is a basic list of daily practices that will help prevent crime.

- · Know your neighbors: exchange contact information.
- . Know where your children are and who they are playing with.
- Use a door viewer before opening your door.
- · Always demand identification from strangers (even repair or sales persons).
- · Keep your vehicles locked at all times.
- . Lock up your home before leaving don't hide your house keys outdoors
- · Have keys ready and in your hand for immediate use when you return home.
- · Install & use interior and exterior lighting.
- Shred credit card offers, bank statements, and other documents that contain your information before you throw them away.
- Hide or destroy boxes from expensive purchases.
- Do not answer personal questions about your home such as type of alarm, daytime occupancy, etc.
- . Do not let strangers inside your home (to use the bathroom, phone, etc.).
- Do not give out your personal information or credit card number over the phone unless you initiated the call.
