



From the Pastor

On April 5, 1943, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German Lutheran pastor, theologian and teacher, was arrested by the Gestapo and thrown into prison, implicated in a plot to assassinate Adolph Hitler; on April 9, 1945, he was executed. His book, *Letters and Papers from Prison*, is a collection of



the letters, essays and poems he wrote while in confinement. Addressed to his parents and to a friend, Eberhard Bethge, who collected the writings and edited the book, they form an extraordinary picture of a sensitive man whose faith and dedication to service never wavered, whose spiritual depth enabled him to overcome the most trying of circumstances.

He was a man of great faith, intelligence and compassion, who understood so well the problems of the modern world. Resisting ease and compromise, he continued his ministering to the other prisoners, his firm resistance to what he knew was wrong, and his brilliant study in theology and ethics until his death.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer never gave up. His writings will continue to provide inspiration to everyone. His theological discussions will open fresh worlds of thought, and his life was indeed a model from which all can benefit.

I read this book some time ago, but what made me think of it was the confinement over the past year (March 2021 officially is the year observance of quarantine), that we all faced in this new world filled with the Covid-19 virus and its variants. This year unlike last year most churches including Victoria Baptist will be able to gather Easter Sunday in person, but still with safety precautions as we aren't out of the woods yet unfortunately! I wanted to share with all of you some of Dietrich's reflections on Easter (go to this link to read more: pdf copy). I find them to be most thoughtful and relevant to what we have and continue to experience:

March 27th, 1944

Perhaps I ought to send you my good wishes for Easter already, for I have no notion how long my letters take to reach you. In looking through Das Neue Lied (The New Song, a book of hymn collections by Kurt Gable) during these days, I am constantly reminded how it is to you principally that I owe my enjoyment of the Easter hymns. It's a year now since I actually heard a hymn. But the music of the inward ear can often surpass that which we hear physically, so long as we really concentrate. Isn't that remarkable? Indeed, there is something purer about it, and in a way, music acquires thereby a 'new body'! There are only a few pieces I know well enough to be able always to hear them inwardly, but I get on particularly well with the Easter hymns. My appreciation of the music Beethoven composed after he went deaf has become more 'existential', and in particular, the great variation from Opus III.

DEATH AND RESURRECTION

Speaking of Easter, do we not attach more importance nowadays to the act of dying than to death itself? We are much more concerned with getting over the act of dying than with being victorious over death. Socrates mastered the art of dying; Christ overcame death as the last enemy (1 Corinthians 15.27). There is a real difference between the two things. The one is within human capacity, the other implies resurrection. We need not 'ars moriendi', (two Latin texts which offer advice on the protocols and procedures of a good death,) the art of dying, but the resurrection of Christ to invigorate and cleanse the world today. Here is the answer to Archimedes' statement, "Give me somewhere to stand and I will move the earth". What a tremendous difference it would make if a few people really believed and acted upon that. To live in the light of the resurrection — that is the meaning of Easter. Do you not also find that so few people seem to know what light it is they live by? This perturbatio animorum (disturbance of spirit) is exceedingly common. It is an unconscious waiting for the word of

deliverance, though the time is hardly ripe yet for it to be heard. But the time will come, and perhaps this Easter is one of the last chances we shall have to prepare ourselves for our future task. I hope you will be able to enjoy it despite all the hardships you are having to bear. Good-bye, I must close now. With all my heart, your Dietrich.

Fortunately, though it may feel as if we are imprisoned to a certain degree, we do have the freedom to celebrate Christ's resurrection. Despite the hardships of the past year: the loss of loved ones and friends, fear of disease and it's spreading, change in lifestyles and what we are able to do, and whatever 2021 will continue to bring, we do know where our eternal future lies!

I pray for a safe and healthy Easter for you and your families! May we proclaim the Risen Lord and His Kingdom that shall reign forever and ever! Amen.
