




As of this writing, the site is being fine-tuned but is already garnering praise and acceptance by the members. The site features easy access to the Master's Calendar, Grand View from the Grand Lodge of Ohio, and pages devoted to Teresa Chapter 257 Order of the Eastern Star. The Web address for the new site is www.proctorvillelodge550.org and the old site is in the process of being discontinued. I think it's one of the nicest web sites that I have experienced and it is easy to use, intuitive, and easy to navigate.

You will be able to look at our "Master's Calendar" showing all of our scheduled events and activities through the year; chat online with other brothers; and have the ability to send questions about needed information related to the Lodge, etc. There is almost no limit to the information and other things going on in our Lodge.

This web page shall serve as our communication hub to all parts of the operation of the Lodge such as:

- Electronic Trestle Board: that displays the "The Master's Calen dar" and all of the upcoming events for the coming month for both the Masonic Lodge and the STAR.
- 2. Robo Calls Will direct communications via e-mail, texting, or

specialized groups of Brothers (committees, etc.) for important or urgent messages.

- 3. Masonic Scuttlebutt: Our Masonic Chat Room
- In-lodge messaging application/s (includes the capability to reach/communicate with all brothers via text messaging, emailing, telephone, & chat room features)
- BricksMasons.com A retail supplier link of all Masonic material & supplies for purchase.

How these changes will affect you:

We are going from one newsletter per year to three newsletters per year in a different and shorter format, which will also reduce the number of pictures that were included previously in the old format. However, you will be able to access many, if not all, pictures that were taken for those events by accessing our new web-site. There will be a link to Instagram (no charge) that enables you to see many more pictures not originally included in the newsletter.

Crafting Unity: Elevating Communication in Our Masonic Lodge, By Daniel Preece, S. Steward

Greetings, brethren and friends. In this edition of our newsletter, we focus on the crucial role of communication in enhancing the unity and effectiveness of our Masonic Lodge. As we embark on this journey of improvement, let us reflect on both the challenges we face and the steps we are taking to overcome them.

Our fraternity, a vibrant assembly of individuals seeking moral and spiritual growth, relies heavily on effective communication to maintain its cohesiveness and purpose. My recent initiation into this brotherhood has allowed me to view our digital presence and communication strategies from both an outsider's and a member's perspective, revealing areas where I'm confident we can significantly improve.

The digital landscape of our Lodge, a key gateway for engaging current and potential members, has presented notable challenges. Our presence on social media, particularly Facebook, has been fragmented and outdated, with some pages not updated for years. This lack of coordination and current information hinders our ability to present a unified, dynamic image of our Lodge. Our website, while functional, does not reflect the vibrancy of our brotherhood, and the scarcity of recent updates fails to convey the depth of our community engagement and the personal growth opportunities we offer.

Internally, we've grappled with issues of information dissemination within the Lodge. The absence of a central, easily accessible calendar has led to last-minute additions and updates, discrepancies between brothers on what event is when, and information attempting to be spread via word-of-mouth which rarely ends up being 100% accurate. A significant portion of our communication has been confined to the Lodge premises, limiting access for members planning their involvement from home. All of these issues resulted in lower event attendance and reduced member engagement.

To address these challenges, our strategy involves two key missions.

This involves developing a more accessible and dynamic calendar system and ensuring timely, accurate information sharing to improve event planning and participation. This will also include implementing strategies to coordinate the dissemination of these events and information through multiple digital and physical mediums. Enhancing our internal communication also means fostering stronger connections between lodges, encouraging camaraderie and collaboration.

Our second mission is to revitalize our public narrative. It is essential that we present our Lodge not as a relic of the past but as a living, active community pillar. We will achieve this by showcasing our commitment to personal development, our involvement in charitable activities, and the positive impact we have on individuals and the community. Highlighting these aspects will not only garner respect for Freemasonry but also attract those seeking to join our ranks.

As we forge ahead, your participation and commitment to these goals are invaluable. We invite each member to contribute to this transformative process. By working together to enhance our internal and external communications, we not only strengthen our brotherly bonds but also extend the reach and influence of our ancient and noble craft. Attending meetings will enable you to develop closer relationships within your lodge that may last throughout the rest of your (hopefully long) life! As you "increase in knowledge, you will improve in social intercourse." This should be the ultimate goal of Masons, to assist in helping your Lodge, your community, and your nation.

District Deputy Grand Master (12th District)

Brethren, upon your receipt of this newsletter, our district inspection season is already in full swing! This is a great time to visit the surrounding lodges in our district and to renew our friendships with our surrounding brothers. This is also a great way to refresh our minds around the meaningful lessons inculcated in our Masonic Degrees. I encourage you to refer to our webpage for a complete schedule of inspections which will last until the end of March.

One of the areas of focus our Grand Master, Most Worshipful Brother Paul A. Weglage, has chosen is membership. The plan is called the 3-5-7 membership plan. The hope is that when our lodges carry out the three pillars of this plan, we will see an increase in our overall membership and reignite the fires of enthusiasm within our membership rolls.

The three areas of the plan are:

- 1) Raise 3% of our 2023 year-end membership as new Master Masons,
- 2) Reinstate 5% of our membership that have left the fraternity, and
- 3) Lose no more than 7% of their membership (demits, withdrawals, suspensions, expulsions, or deaths).

In addition to this plan, all Ohio Lodges are strongly encouraged to hold an Open House during the month of April as a time to invite
