Tornado Damage: Roof Replacement & Interior Repairs

On April 2, 2024, our roof and interior structure was badly damaged during a tornado that also hit numerous surrounding structures in the Proctorville-Rome area. As a result, we were able to receive approval from our insurance company to have the roof completely replaced. Fortunately, our Trustees were able to solicit bids from area businesses very timely and were able to sign a contract for replacement of the roof this last week. It is estimated that work will begin in the next three to four weeks and take only four days to complete. Preliminary work on making emergency repairs to the roof took place within about three days after the storm, most likely, saving our building from sustaining further damage in the event of further storms occurring. Our total costs for this entire project will be approximately \$1,500.00. The repair of interior walls & painting will commence in the near future. In many respects, we were very fortunate in the way things turned out. It could have been much worse.

NEW CAMERA SYSTEM

The Lodge has decided that there is a need to install a security system in our building as a result of the huge growth of activities within the building and grounds in the recent years. Although growth is a positive thing with respect to the many functions that both our Lodge and the Eastern Star conducts throughout the year, we have come to the conclusion that there is a need to provide reasonable security for the day and night time as well. As a result, we are in the process of installing cameras in the interior and exterior areas of the building grounds and entrance areas in particular. There is also discussion about locking the building entrances during our stated meetings to provide added protection of all members and said property. If this "lock-down" is implemented, then there will be a monitoring system to ensure that latecoming members are permitted to enter the Lodge. We wish to thank Brothers Nathan White (JW) and Daniel Preece (SS) for installing the system and for their expertise in the selection of this system.

Apple Butter Equipment Revamped

This past number of months our Lodge has spent an extraordinary amount of time and effort to upgrade our Apple Butter equipment for the ensuing fall season. We are committed, with the Eastern Star, to once again participate in The Milton Pumpkin Festival, Bob Evans Festival, Proctorville Festival and the Chesapeake Octoberfest. This does not even include the huge number of sales that we derive from selling our product from the Lodge itself. It is imperative that we not only maintain and upgrade our existing and aging equipment but we must also look to find more effective/ efficient ways to process our product with the limited manpower that we have. In effort to get ahead of the curve, so to speak, The Lodge, (with the Eastern Star) has purchased two "Apple slicing units" to replace the outdated and cumbersome machine that we currently use. It requires anywhere from 4-6 persons to operate effectively and to provide the product timely for each day's production operation. The new units will allow us to reduce the needed manpower by half, and even more importantly, we can accelerate this process of coring apples 2 -3 times quicker. This means that we could essentially complete the entire process in one workday vs. three days. The equipment is made of washable surfaces (vs. wood) which will allow us to easily clean and sanitize the machine for use as well. Additionally, Worshipful Brothers Jimmy Perry and Larry Thompson are currently building and upgrading a stirring machine replacement for our existing unit. New processing techniques are being developed that continue to reduce not only the required manpower to process our apple butter in less time but also maintain the quality of our product that we are known for in the area. Thanks to the brothers of the Lodge, Eastern Star and community for your overwhelming support in the past... as well as the future.


We were blessed with Brothers in attendance from four different states. Registration started on Saturday at 8:00 a.m. with doughnuts and coffee.
