CARES ACT – CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUNDS

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was passed by Congress with overwhelming, bipartisan support and signed into law by President Trump on March 27th, 2020. Small local governments like Amherst Township received federal CARES funds through Ohio HB481 and SB357. Amherst Township received a total of \$329,929 in CARES Act funding through four separate distributions from the middle of July through late November, the largest distribution of \$207,314 being received in the middle of October. The Ohio legislation required these funds to be encumbered by late November and spent by the end of December 2020 for eligible materials, services and projects. The majority of these funds were used for Fire and First Responder Emergency Medical Services.

The CARES Act required that the payments from the Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) only be used to cover expenses that:

- Were necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19;
- Were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of March 27,2020; and
- Were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020 and ends on December 30, 2020.

The Trustees sought direction from these sources to ensure compliance with the above 3 requirements:

- Lorain County Prosecutor, obtaining written opinions;
- Ohio Office of Budget Management; and
- U.S. Treasury Guidelines

It took a tremendous amount of effort with a very short timeline to create and define these projects. It was challenging finding contractors that would be able to complete these projects on short notice as well as being able to obtain the supplies for these projects. Many of the supplies were in high demand due to COVID-19 as well as having the supply chain negatively impacted by COVID-19.

Residents should be proud of the work that their township employees and elected officials did to ensure all allotted **CRF** tax dollars were used for the benefit of Amherst Township residents. If these funds had not been used in our township, or spent by the legislative deadlines, the funds would be

either redistributed to other Lorain County communities or returned to the U.S. Treasury.

Following is a summary of the **CRF** projects:

<u>Fire and First Responder Services:</u> U.S. Treasury presumed work performed by these employees to be a substantially different use than accounted for in the most recent budget and all costs of these employees may be covered using CRF from March 1 to December 30, 2020.

Ambulance Subgrant: This subgrant to LifeCare will be used for equipment to decontaminate, disinfect and sanitize equipment and areas. It also includes a Lucus heart CPR machine and K95 masks. Amherst City and South Amherst are part of this sub grant which was portioned by population.

Park Pavilion, Walk/Bike Path, & Parking Lot:

To encourage social distancing and outdoor activity, a pavilion was constructed and 2 concrete pads were poured to allow for an additional 8 picnic tables at the MRR Township Park. For safety issues, the leveling, crack sealing, and overall seal coating of the trail and parking lot were expedited due to increased usage.

<u>Yard Waste Surveillance System:</u> To allow for non-contact monitoring of the Yard Waste Drop Off area. Cameras will be equipped with a sound system to facilitate verbal communication as well as visual observation.

<u>Video/Audio Equipment for Meetings:</u> To allow for public viewing and/or participation in Public Hearings and at Public Meetings.

<u>**Telework:**</u> To give employees the ability to work remotely from home.

Generator Installation: Amherst Township has been designated as an Emergency Shelter by the Red Cross. NOPEC grant funds have paid for ¾ of this project. The remaining ¼ was paid with CRF in order to complete this project in 2020.

<u>Cleaning and No Touch Equipment:</u> This project included alternate cleaning source, deep cleaning of the Township Hall, and No-Touch Soap & Towel Dispensers, Faucets, and Light Switches.

New lighting and cameras are being installed at the Township "Yard Waste" Recycling Center. The cameras will be equipped with a sound system so employees can safely communicate with users remotely, verifying their residency and drop off of only acceptable materials. Preparing for Winter

- As a safety issue, please do not pile snow around fire hydrants. It is best to keep hydrants clear of any snow, excess mounding of soil, or plants.
- Also, when cleaning your driveways, do not plow or shovel snow onto the streets after the Township/County has plowed.
- Mailboxes should be inspected to make sure the posts are in good condition before the winter snowplowing begins.
- Be aware that the bridge decks freeze before the pavement does, causing them to be slippery even when the roads are clear.





Road Levy Renewal

A 1-mil 5-year Road and Bridge Levy renewal will appear on the May 15, 2021 Primary ballot. This levy was first approved by the residents of Amherst Township in November of 2011 and again in March of 2016. Upon approval of the levy in 2011, the Amherst Township Board of Trustees reduced the collection of an existing Fire and EMS levy to ensure no tax increase would be experienced by property owners in Amherst Township.

Approval of this levy renewal will not increase property taxes, but will provide \$123,413 for the reconstruction, resurfacing and repair of roads and bridges in Amherst Township pursuant to Ohio Revised Cod 5705.19(G).

PERMITS REQUIRED

Residents are reminded that permits are needed for pools, decks, porches, patios, gazebos, fences, ponds, signs, garages, new construction, building additions, accessory buildings, and driveways. When a permit is obtained before the start of construction, the fee will be reduced by 50%. Be sure you or your contractor has obtained a permit. **Payments must be made by check only.** Cash is not accepted.

Please contact Remi Cerrone, Amherst Township Zoning Inspector for these permits. Office hours for the Zoning Inspector are from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays. He can be reached at 988-5894. Voice Mail is checked daily.

Building Inspections are not required. It is recommended that residents hire their own inspectors.

DRIVEWAY APRONS

Residents are also reminded that when a road project requires modification of a drive apron, as a general rule, the drive apron modification will be completed with the same material as the road project. In all cases, maintenance of a drive apron is the responsibility of the property owner.



<u>Christmas Tree</u> <u>Disposal</u>



Amherst Township residents may bring their live Christmas Trees to the Amherst Township property located on the <u>EAST</u> side of Oberlin Road (directly across from the Township Garage, which is located at 7530 Oberlin Road) Monday thru Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and on Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Residents may also leave live trees on their lawn near the road. The township road crew will be picking up these trees **Thur.**, **Dec 26**th **thru Mon.**, **Jan 25**th.





SNOW BAN





Parking is prohibited on all township streets and highways in Amherst Township during a snow emergency, which may be declared when snowfall exceeds 2 inches or severe snow or ice condition exists.

A fine for violation of this resolution will be \$50 if paid within seven days of the violation and \$100 if paid more than seven days of the violation.

To avoid having your vehicle towed or ticketed, residents are asked not to park on the street when the snow exceeds 2 inches.
