

2022 Battenhouse Ditch Restoration



The Lorain County Storm Water District agreed to fully fund the 2022 Community Grant project submitted by Amherst Township. The project begins at the east branch of Beaver Creek near the intersection of Middle Ridge and Dewey Road, and follows a 3,900-ft easterly upstream course to the Lakeshore Railroad just west of Oberlin Road.

This project will reduce flooding and safety hazards for the motoring public along Stang and Oberlin Roads, overloading of on-lot wastewater treatment systems, infiltration of areas equipped with sanitary

L.C. SOLID WASTE GRANT

The "Community Incentive Grant" is an annual grant offered by the Lorain County Solid Waste Management District (LCSWMD). This grant program is to assist communities to strive for and exceed Ohio's goal of recycling 25% of materials generated by the residential sector. The township will be receiving \$7,831.25 for 2022 which will be used towards the grinding, removal, and recycling of the yard waste pile and funding the newsletter.

sewers, flooding of basements, occasional limits on access for Safety/EMS/Fire vehicles, and loss of agricultural yields and/or land use.

The estimated project cost is \$88,891, with \$17,796 being provided by Amherst Township and \$71,185 being provided by the Lorain County Storm Water District. Upon obtaining access easements from various property owners and public utilities, the Board of Trustees will publicly bid the project. The township hopes to begin this project in 2022.

Yard Waste Recycling Center Extended Summer Hours

As a reminder to residents, the "Yard Waste Pile" that is located on the east side of Oberlin Road, directly across from the Township Hall/Garage, will be open until 8pm on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month, which coincides with the Trustees Meeting nights. These extended hours will continue through the summer and early fall.

The yard waste pile is for disposing of your limbs, brush, lawn clippings, and leaves. Residents are reminded to please place your empty plastic bags in the 55-gallon drum at the center, or take bags with you.

LCSWD MINI-GRANT

For the sixth year Amherst Township applied for and received \$7500 from the Lorain County Storm Water District (LCSWD) Mini-Grant. The funding amount was increased this year for qualified storm water management projects and still requires a 20% minimum financial match from the township.

Amherst Township will be using this year's funding towards replacing approximately 360-ft of existing storm sewer pipe on the east side of Broadway St. Once the new pipe has been installed approximately 600-ft of the existing ditch to the north will be cleared. Total estimated cost of this project is \$17,850 with the township contributing \$10,350.

By replacing the storm sewer pipe there will be a decrease of storm water backup into resident's homes. By clearing the ditch, the flow away from these homes should increase due to lessened obstructions and a repaired storm sewer.

DoorDash Helping Second Harvest

As reported in the Chronicle Telegram (5/28/22):

Second Harvest Food Bank and DoorDash are teaming up to deliver food boxes to seniors.

ProjectDASH has been testing food deliveries to older Lorain County residents throughout May. Eligible seniors can have shelf stable food, cheese, and produce delivered to them at home as part of this monthly program.

"Seniors now make up more than 18 percent of who is served at food pantries, but we know many are still unable to access help because of a lack of transportation or mobility," said Julie Chase-Morefield, president and CEO of Second Harvest.

The effort is funded through the federal "Commodity Supplemental Food Program", which Second Harvest has been a part of since 2015. During the COVID-19 pandemic, members of the National Guard delivered boxes and dedicated volunteers continued the program. Second Harvest was limited to serving 80 seniors each month with the help of volunteers, but can now enroll more seniors through **ProjectDASH**.

It can deliver within a 10-mile radius of Second Harvest's Baumhart Road facility in Lorain, which is the designated hub. That reach extends to Lorain, Vermilion, Amherst, Amherst Township, and parts of Elyria Township and Sheffield.

As the program expands, Second Harvest will look to set up additional hubs in strategic locations to expand its reach.

The program is open to residents 60 or older with an income at or below 130 percent of the federal poverty line, currently \$17,667 annually for a single person. Seniors can call Second Harvest from 8am to 4:30pm Monday through Friday at (440) 960-2265 to apply for the program.

PERMITS REQUIRED

Residents are reminded that permits are needed for pools, decks, porches, patios, gazebos, fences, ponds, signs, garages, new construction, building additions, accessory buildings, and driveways. When a permit is obtained before the start of construction, the fee will be reduced by 50%. Be sure you or your contractor has obtained a permit. Payments must be made by check only. Cash is not accepted.

Please contact Remi Cerrone, Amherst Township Zoning Inspector for these permits. Office hours for the Zoning Inspector are from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays. He can be reached at 988-5894. Voice Mail is checked daily.

Building Inspections are not required. It is recommended that residents hire their own inspectors.

DRIVEWAY APRONS

Residents are also reminded that when a road project requires modification of a drive apron, as a general rule, the drive apron modification will be completed with the same material as the road project. In all cases, maintenance of a drive apron is the responsibility of the property owner.
