

About the Baltimore Gamer Symphony Orchestra:

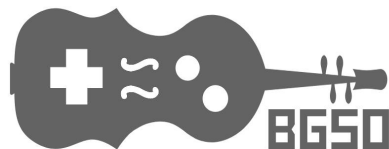

Additionally, we accept members of all musical levels and backgrounds to foster a renewed sense of pride in one's musicality.

Donating to our orchestra is tax deductible, and welcomed so that we can fund instrument repairs and rentals or further events in the community.

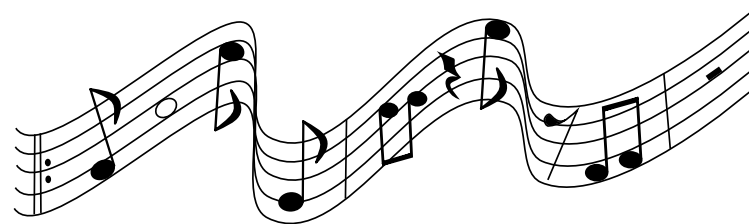
