WHO WE ARE.



Our Story:

Minot Area Recovery Community Organization was started as the Mayor's Committee on Addiction in 2018. We started as a group that got together to try to combat the opioid epidemic that was impacting Minot.

Throughout the years, and through a pandemic, the board of directors, in conjunction with the city, decided that it would be best if we became our own entity.

Thus, MARCO was born.

In 2021, MARCO officially became a 501(c)(3) nonprofit. During this time, our mission and vision statements were formed and ideas of the best solution for our city were being discussed.

In May of 2022, our first full-time employee was hired as Executive Director, and things have grown exponentially from there. More can be read about the progress later in this report.

- MARCO's mission is to assist individuals and families with substance use disorder in Minot and the surrounding communities.
- We envision a community that is recovery ready with comprehensive and interconnected recovery services.

PEER SUPPORT

Our staff offer their lived experience with substance use disorder, what they've done to find and maintain recovery, and more.



CARE COORDINATION

Our staff helps individuals find all the services they need, whether that's as a simple weekly check-in or more comprehensive services like inpatient treatment, or anything in-between!

Community Connect

Offering Care Coordination and Peer Support to individuals with a qualifying diagnosis in North Dakota.



Free Through Recovery

Offering Care Coordination and Peer Support to individuals on probation/parole in North Dakota.

MARCO offered weekly All Recovery Meetings, Pro-social events (game nights, yoga, and more), and Workshops.




