MOTUS O. After the Islamic Revolution of 1979, Marina was arrested at the age of sixteen and spent more than two years in Evin, a political prison in Tehran, where she was tortured and came very close to execution. She came to Canada in 1991 and has called it home ever since. Marina's book *Prisoner of Tehran* has been published in 28 other countries and is an international bestseller.
