NATIONAL POLICE OFFICERS' WEEK—Today (May 13) marks the beginning of National Police Week. Proclaimed in 1963 by President Kennedy, this week is set aside to honor and remember those who serve and those whose service has ended. At the National Law Enforcement Officers' Memorial in Washington, DC today, the names of 360 officers will be added to the walls of the Memorial at a candlelight vigil. This includes 128 who died in 2017 and deaths from previous years that were recently discovered through research and historical records. On May 15, Peace Officers' Memorial Day, families of the fallen will gather on the grounds of the US Capitol for a service honoring those who died in 2017. Please keep these survivors in your prayers as they walk their grief journey, and pray that all law enforcement who work to keep us safe will remain healthy and safe.

FOOD DRIVE FOR DUNEDIN CARES FOOD PANTRY – Through May 15th, Dunedin Cares Food Pantry will be having a food drive to encourage local businesses, churches, civic organizations to help stock their shelves for the increased demand for breakfast and luncheon items during the summer months when school is out.
