Queensland Cypress or white cypress has a consistent colour being light yellow and light brown (gold), with occasional dark brown streaks and knots. It is an extremely durable softwood, termite resistant with a low shrinkage rate. Cypress is sourced from sustainable plantations in central-western Queensland and various other plantations across Australia.



Safe handling

- Wear appropriate PPE
- Work in a ventilated area

Typical uses

Cypress pine is a durable and longlasting choice for fencing. Its natural resistance to decay and termite attack means that it can withstand exposure to the elements for many years without deteriorating. Cypress pine is also relatively easy to work with and can be easily machined, sanded, painted or stained. These properties make it a popular choice for outdoor projects

Maintenance

Natural finish: Timber can be left uncoated; it will naturally fade to a silver-grey colour.

Applying a log end sealer to post tops can slow drying and minimise checks.

Checking (small cracks) is normal in natural timber and unpredictable in some cases.
