

The SAVE America Act
Brief Background

At a Glance:

- Addresses non-citizens voting in Federal elections and requires a government photo ID.
- Senate Majority Leader John Thune (R-SD) has brought the legislation up for a lengthy debate, votes on amendments, and will seek to have a vote on passing the bill.
- The legislation must clear a 60-vote threshold to overcome a Democrat filibuster, unless Republicans can wear down Democrats' resistance or decide to eliminate the filibuster rule.

Key Provisions:

- Requires proof of citizenship and a government photo ID to vote in Federal elections.
- Requires states to remove non-citizens from their voter rolls and gives them prompt, no-cost access to Federal databases with citizenship information.
- Allows applicants to provide documentation to resolve discrepancies [e.g., a name change] regarding proof of U.S. citizenship, and makes accommodations for disabled Americans.
- President Trump has requested a provision to eliminate mail-in ballots (except for illness, disability, military or travel).
- Senate Republicans have offered amendments addressing radical gender policies, including the issues of men in women's sports and gender transition procedures for minors.

Why it Matters for Pastors:

- Some states allow non-citizens to obtain driver's licenses.
 - Millions of aliens were released into the U.S. during the Biden Administration and another two million "gotaways" are known to have entered the country illegally during Biden's term.
 - These circumstances have created a high risk that millions of Americans will effectively be disenfranchised by allowing ineligible people to cancel the impact of their votes.
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
